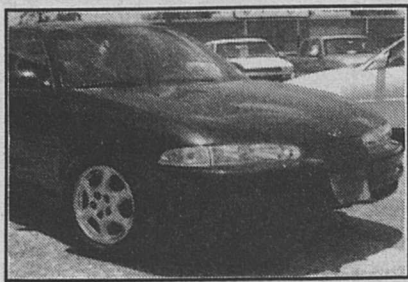

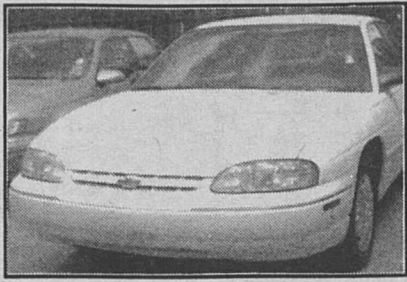

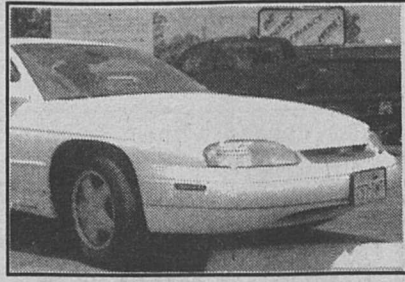

Make the most of sales tax holiday

The State of Texas will once again eliminate sales tax for back to school shoppers Aug. 4-6.

The sales tax holiday is designed to make back to school shopping less expensive for consumers but everyone can benefit from the approximate

8% savings on selected clothing and footwear.

Consumers can save time by buying electronics, school supplies and other items not covered by the holiday before the sales tax holiday rush.

Last year, adults planned to spend an average of \$297 on apparel, \$171 on electronics and \$51 on school supplies, the International Mass Retail Association reports.

Consumer Credit Counseling Service (CCCS) of The Gulf Coast Area Inc. offers tips on how to make the most of the sales tax holiday. CCCS is a non-profit credit counseling organization that offers debt and credit counseling and education.

Six sales tax holiday tips for back to school shoppers:

1. Create a written back to school list. Inventory your children's clothing and electronic needs first. Then, write down what additional items are needed to prepare your children for school. Hand me downs are a great way to cut costs in large families.

2. Review exempt item list. Not all clothing and footwear under \$100

is covered. For example, cowboy boots will be tax exempt but climbing boots won't. For a complete list, contact the Texas Comptroller's Office at 1-800-252-5555 or visit its web site at www.window.state.tx.us.

3. Spread out your expenses. Buying non-exempt items in July and exempt items during the sales tax holiday is a good way to spread out a major expense, which for many adults exceeds \$500.

4. Take your 8% discount. Stock up on blouses, dresses, jackets, jeans, jogging apparel, pants, shirts, skirts, uniforms, workout clothes and other exempt items.

5. Use credit wisely. Pay with cash if possible. If you have to use credit, try to limit purchases to items you can pay off in 90 days.

6. Get help if needed. Back to school expenses can wreck an already stretched budget. If you need help, schedule a visit with a certified CCCS credit counselor by calling 1-800-873-2227.

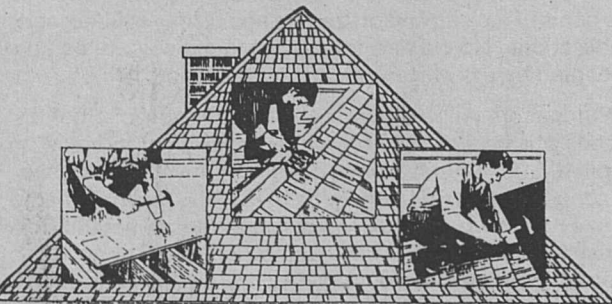
