Missionary Baptist Church Mission Lesson

Area: "Development of the 'Spiritual' Life".

Theme: "Living the Spiritual Life".

First Week: "What is a Spiritual Christian?" - II Tim. 1:7

A question. Apostle Paul, the writer of this book, to his young son, in

the ministry, reminding Timothy of his charge. II Tim 1:7, Paul says, "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind".

A spiritual life is a believer, baptized, by the blood of Jesus Christ that has Agapy (spiritual) love for everybody, in spite of how you're treated. Paul said in Rom. 8:9, "Now if any man (or woman) have not the Spirit of Christ (notice not Jesus, Christ, change the flavor) he is not of His." A spiritual Christian must expect a struggle between flesh and spirit as long as we are in the world.

Second Week: "What Does the Holy Spirit Do?" - John 16:14

The Gospel of John is the deity book. The Holy Spirit does much more than make us jump and holler. The Holy Spirit dwells in the heart (mind) of the believer. He will guide us into all truth. He will (will is a precious promise) show us things to come. In time of trouble, He will hide us in His pavilion (a divine umbrella of His Holy wings) in the secret of His tabernacle shall He hide us, and shall set us up, upon a rock. Psalms 27:5.

The Holy Spirit will increase our capacity (give us the ability to comprehend or better understand). He will quicken our intelligence. You remember when Apostle Paul said in I Cor. 12:1, "Now concerning spiritual gifts brethren, I would not have you ignorant". You don't have to babble (lack of understanding). When we can rightly divide the word of truth, the Holy Spirit will empower the believer for life and service. He is our divine teacher.

Third Week: "Being Filled With The Holy Spirit" - Acts 2:4

The history book of the New Testament is Acts, written by Dr. Luke. You're talking about a year (2000 t.v.) break through.

On the day of Pentecost, 50 days after the resurrection of Christ Jesus, the record said, Acts 2:2, suddenly (means quickly, without warning, unexpected) the promise Jesus made in John 16:7, was being fulfilled. "Suddenly there came a sound from Heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind," verse four says, "They (120) people in the upper room, were all filled with the Holy Ghost."

Fourth Week: "Walking in the Spirit" - Gal. 5:16


Fifth Week: "Grieving the Holy Spirit" - Eph. 4:23

his honor at the Lissie United Methodist Church at 12 noon Saturday, August 5, 2000.





6,171 Texas residents, Progressive Auto Insurance found that respondents could have paid up to \$558 less every six months for coverage from a provider other than their present provider.

The Texas data was among that collected from some 90,000 consumers across the nation who called Progressive or visited the company's web site between Jan. 1 and June 30 and received a "premium variance" rate comparison for Progressive and three other leading insurers.

"It's simply amazing what people will do to save a few cents here or there, but they won't even consider the savings on automobile insurance," said Willy Graves, president of Progressive County Mutual of Texas.

Water Quality Standards Set
The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission last week adopted updated standards for surface water in Texas.

The standards are intended to protect drinking water supplies, aquatic life, recreation and other uses.

"Taken on the whole, these updated standards are stronger and more protective of Texas waters," said TNRCC Chairman Robert J. Huston.

However, Huston added, "Where unrealistic standards for specific waters were previously presumed, we've adopted changes which are based upon what good science tells us."

Other Highlights

•The Texas Department of Health has launched efforts to detect and monitor the West Nile virus, which can be transmitted by mosquito species likely to feed on birds migrating from the northeastern United States through the Gulf Coast. Mild infections of mosquito-borne encephalitis may occur with only a headache. More severe infections may include headache, high fever, neck stiffness, disorientation, coma and tremors.

•Texas Parks and Wildlife will conduct a series of public meetings in August to gather input on proposed changes to its white-tailed deer Trap, Transport and Transplant permit program. The agency is expected to make a final decision Aug. 31 in Austin.
