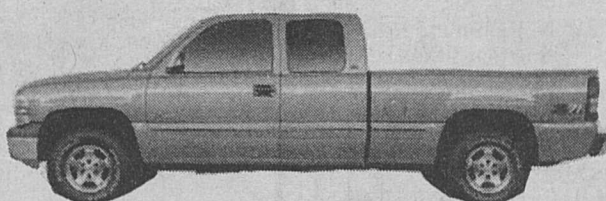

drug paraphernalia from the residence.

Fifty-three-year-old David Rowland was arrested and charged with possession of drug paraphernalia (Class C) and delivery of marijuana to a minor, a second degree felony which carries a penalty range of two to 20 years in the penitentiary and up to a \$10,000 fine.

Rowland's bond was set at

\$10,000.

Eighteen-year-old Brandon Rowland was also arrested during the operation and charged with Class B possession of marijuana and an outstanding warrant out of Fort Bend County for assault.

The 14-year-old male, who was reportedly intoxicated on rum and marijuana, was released into the care of a relative.

The fire department used foam to protect Pettus, allowing them to move him to the waiting ambulance.

Three LCRA employees were close by and, in the usual LCRA fashion, volunteered to assist. The LCRA employees transported a reluctant Officer Alley to the hospital at the demand of her fellow officers.

Even while Alley was removing parts of her uniform which still contained the bees, she attempted to run back into the swarm to assist others and had to be persuaded to receive medical attention.

After some time was spent evacu-

ating nearby residents and closing off a section of Old Altair Road, Pettus, Young, 55-year-old New Town resident Georgia Hemphill and Officer Alley sought treatment at the Rice Medical Center.

Drs. Len Bornstein and Ramon Cantu, along with the emergency room staff, administered treatment and removed hundreds of stingers imbedded in the victims. The hospital staff also killed numerous bees, still alive inside the victims' clothing.

All the victims were later released with the exception of Pettus, who was held overnight for observation.

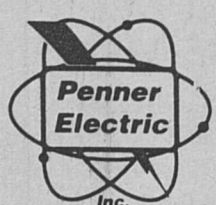

operated as agreed upon by the operator contracted to run the golf course and the City. In the event there is no contractor to operate the golf course it shall be operated under rules established by the City Council.

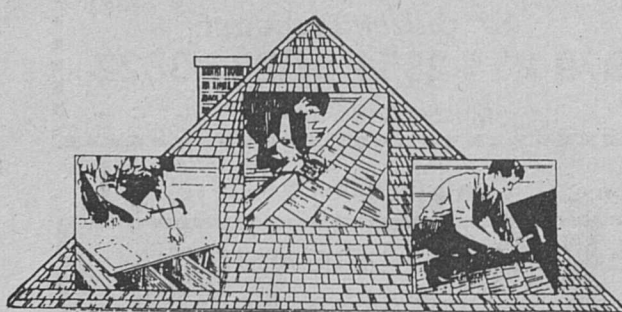
Section 5. Joe S. Reed Jr. Tennis and Recreation Area. Lights are provided in this area for playing tennis after dark. Lights are to be used solely for the purpose of playing tennis and for no other reason.

Section 6. Swimming Pool-Playground Area-Picnic Area. The hours of operation for the playground and picnic areas shall be from 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sundown. The swimming pool shall operate during those hours designated by the City Council and shall be closed to the public at all other times.

Section 7. E.H. Henry Recreation Area. The hours of operation for the E.H. Henry Recreation Area shall be from 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sundown.

Section 8. Wintermound Wildlife Area. The hours of operation for the wildlife area shall be from 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sundown.

Section 9. Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be found guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and anyone convicted of said violation shall be fined in any sum not less than \$25 and no more than \$500.
