

Rice CISD meal prices

The Rice CISD cafeterias will begin serving breakfasts and lunches Monday, Aug. 14. Meal prices will be: Pre-k through 5th: \$1.50 for lunch, 75¢ breakfast;

Grades 6-12: \$1.75 for lunch, \$1 breakfast;

Reduced price lunch: 40¢;

Reduced price breakfast-30¢;

Adult: lunch \$2.25, breakfast, \$1.25;

Visitor: lunch \$2.75, breakfast, \$1.50

All cafeterias in the district do sell full and reduced price long-term tickets for lunch to students, as well as adults, before breakfast is served or any other time beside serving time. The managers are not allowed, by the Child Nutrition Program, to sell tickets on the line. Parents and staff, please take note of this and make arrangements with the managers for the specific time to purchase the tickets instead of expecting them to keep a running tab for your convenience.

Parents: This is a reminder that, if your child/children receive(s) free lunch, they are also eligible for a free

breakfast. Therefore, please encourage your child/children to eat breakfast at school.

Parents: As per Texas Education Agency guidelines, when your child has four charges, the Rice District cafeteria managers are not required to offer your child a breakfast or lunch.

So, please remember to send money each day or buy a long-term ticket because it will be very embarrassing for your child to get to the end of the line and not have any money and the manager will have to ask him, or her, to leave their tray on the counter.

Reduced price meals applications will be given to all students the first day of school. They must be completed and returned by Sept. 1 (see qualification chart at right). A new application has to be completed each year to qualify for benefits. So remember to get your application in as requested.

After processing the lunch applications, students will pick up their lunch cards from their respective cafeteria manager.

Aug. 23: B: pancake/sausage on a stick, juice, milk; L: cheeseburger, burger salad, fries/catsup, applesauce cake, milk.

Aug. 24: B: combo bar, French toast stick, juice, milk; L: enchiladas, lettuce/tomatoes, pineapple tidbits, flour tortillas, milk.

Aug. 25: B: honeybun, breakfast patty, juice, milk; L: hoagie bun, chips, vegetable trimmings, fruit, graham crackers, milk.

Aug. 28: B: biscuit & sausage, jelly, juice, milk; L: steak fingers, cheesy noodles, peas with onions, chilled peaches, hot rolls, milk.

Aug. 29: B: pig-in-a-blanket, juice, milk; L: turkey tenders, rice with gravy, mixed vegetables, rosy applesauce, angel biscuit, milk.

Aug. 30: B: pancakes, syrup, juice, milk; L: barbecue on bun, shoestring fries, catsup, rice krispie square, fruit, milk.

Aug. 31: B: breakfast pizza, juice, milk; L: frito pie, corn, salad/dressing, chocolate cake/icing, crackers, milk.

Sheridan School student supply lists
