Texas State Technical College will register new students for the fall semester weekdays through Sept. 5. Fall classes begin Sept. 6.

Students can register from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays through Sept. 5, with extended hours from 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Sept. 5. The campus will close Labor Day, Sept. 4.

TSTC will also offer special weekend registration hours from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 26.

The new student registration process begins in College Relations, located in the Student Services Center on Campus Drive.

Students who plan to enroll the fall semester can also take advantage of TSTC's admission information sessions from 9 a.m. to noon, each Friday through Aug. 11.

The sessions, which take place in the Student Services Center, provide visitors with a general TSTC overview, details about admissions, financial assistance, counseling and testing requirements.

Representatives also offer tips about the registration process, the variety of student services and tours of individual technologies.

Students can apply for a full range of financial aid options, from the federal Pell Grant to guaranteed student loans. USDA/Rural Development offers home ownership

Steven A. Carriker, State Director, Texas USDA Rural Development announced that even though the fiscal year is quickly drawing to a close, there are still ample federal funds available for Guaranteed Rural Housing loans.

To be eligible for financing, the

home must be located in a rural community with less than 10,000 population, on a farm or in open country not closely associated with an urban area. Under certain circumstances loans can be made in towns and cities between 10,000 and 25,000 in population.

homes that are structurally sound and have adequate mechanical, electrical, plumbing and insulation systems.

The loan may be made for up to 100% of the market value. There is no down payment required.

The lender may loan some closing costs depending on the appraisal.

Theoretically, someone could move into a home for zero out of pocket expenses.

Typically, however, not all the costs associated with buying a home can be financed. All loans must be secured by a first lien on a residential property.
