

In 1998, travelers spent \$34.6 billion in Texas, a 6.5 percent increase over 1997. Texas' share of the domestic travel market is 6 percent-only California and Florida have a greater market share. Visitor spending in 1998 supported 370,000 jobs, and generated \$572 million in local taxes and \$1.7 billion in state tax revenues.
