A third-generation farmer, Stallman also has been selected to serve on various state and federal committees. In 1996, Texas Gov. George W. Bush appointed him to the citizen's committee on property tax relief.

That same year, he was appointed by then-House Agriculture Committee Chairman Pat Roberts to the commission on 21st century production agriculture, a panel that is conducting

extensive hearings on future farm policy alternatives.

The main purpose of this annual meeting is to adopt policies for the coming year.

Directors will also be elected at this time as will voting delegates to represent Colorado County at the state convention to be held Nov. 26-29 in Arlington.


Deloris Erleen Middleton, 42, of Eagle Lake passed away at her residence Tuesday, August 22, 2000.

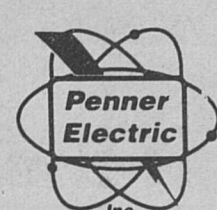


