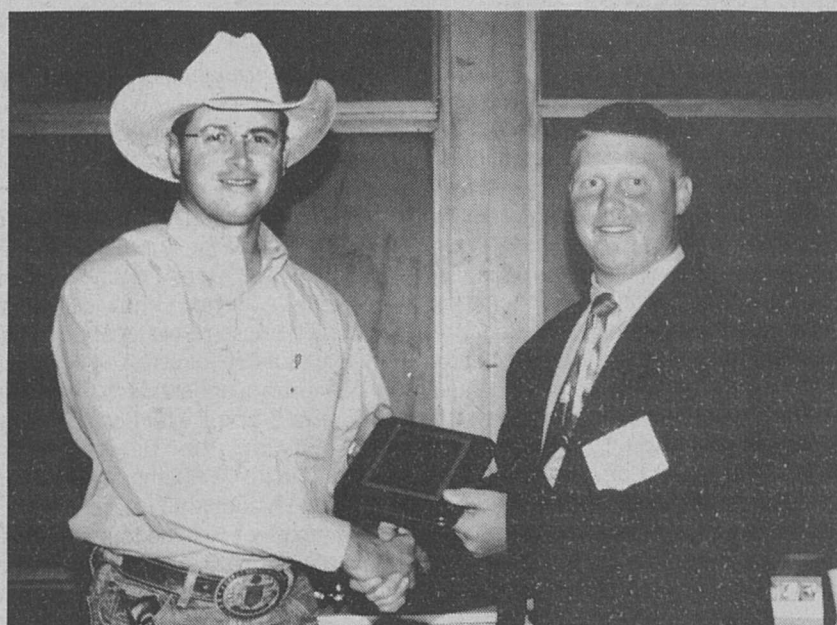

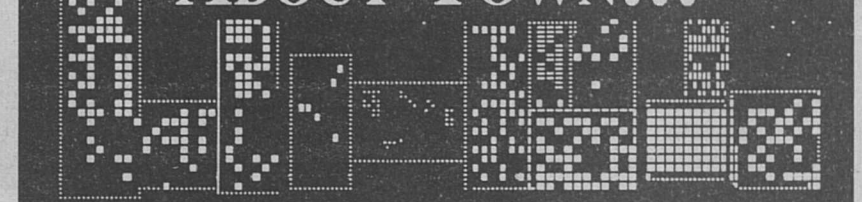


Little places in TCFA Challenge
