Ernest Brister Uzzell, of Hurst, formerly of Eagle Lake, passed away Tuesday, August 15, 2000 at All Saints Hospital in Fort Worth.

Born September 16, 1918 in Alvin, he was the son of Will and Maggie Brister Uzzell.

A veteran of World War II, he served in the U.S. Army under General George Patton during the European Campaign and the Battle of the Bulge.

Uzzell lived in Eagle Lake for five years and Altair for 25 years; was part owner and manager of Altair Rice Dryer for over 30 years; served on the Eagle Lake and Rice Consolidated School Boards, was a member of the First United Methodist Church, Rotary Club and a 32nd Degree Mason.



"DEAD-LIP" SYNDROME

Most of our patients don't have any problems with the use of local anesthetics that we use to reduce the discomfort caused by some dental procedures. For some of you, the anesthetic needle may inspire some fear. Others are disturbed by the numbness in your lips and tongue - the "dead-lip syndrome". Well, modern advances in anesthesia technique can help with both these problems.

First, improved topical anesthetics can numb the surface of the gum and reduce - or even eliminate - the prick of the needle.

Secondly, a new technique em-

playing extra-fine injection needles now makes it possible to "deadend" only a single tooth rather than the whole jaw. With these extremely delicate needles, we can place the anesthetic through the ligament and into the nerve that is connected to the individual tooth. This kind of intraligament injection works quickly, leaves no "dead-lip", and according to some patients, is almost unnoticeable.

Coping with Honey Bee problems

Colorado County Honey Bee Workshop and Training meeting will be held Monday, Sept. 25, at 7 p.m. in the County Agriculture Building, at 316 Spring St. in Columbus.

This workshop and training will cover:

- Dealing with honey bee swarms;
- How to protect yourself from bee stings;
- Eliminating problem bees;
- How to identify Africanized Honey Bees;
- Removal of honey bees; and
- Developing a honey bee response plan.

Conducting the workshop will be Dr. Rodney Holloway, Associate Professor and Extension Pesticide Assessment Specialist, Apiary, with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, along with Harvey Neubauer, a local beekeeper. Following the training meeting, a response plan for honey bee attacks will be made.

The arrival of Africanized Honey Bees in the U.S. has heightened concerns about the potential health-related dangers of the insects. A number of bee insects have occurred this past year, with all of the specimens being identified as European Bees.

This program should be of benefit to emergency management personnel, sheriff's department, city police departments, hospital personnel, county commissioners, beekeepers and other interested persons.
