### Eddie and Evelyn Orange Named Parade Marshals

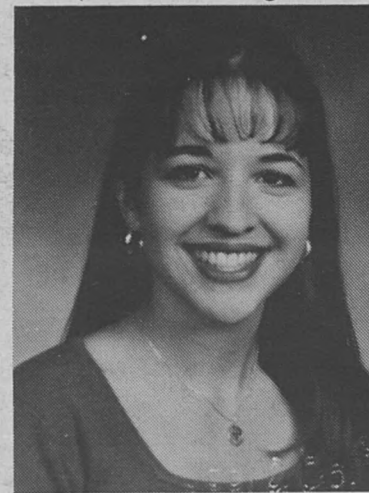

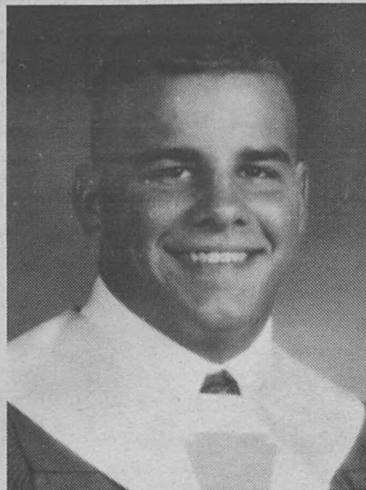
