Rice CISD School Board hears reports from campus principals

The Board of Trustees for the Rice Consolidated Independent School District called the regular scheduled meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Sept. 11. All members were present.

After the minutes were corrected and approved for both meetings on Aug. 14 and 22, the payment of bills was discussed and accepted. The members then heard reports from the administrators of each campus.

Bill Hefner, principal of Garwood, stated that all was well and announced Grandparent's Day. It will be held during lunch Thursday, Sept. 14. He expected a good turnout.

Gene Glover, principal of Eagle Lake Middle School, gave an update on his campus stating that the teachers are actively participating in the staff development given in cooperation with University of Houston in Victoria, Region 3 and the Eisenhower Grant program. It focuses on several areas including TAAS. He also announced Open House to be held Tuesday, Sept. 12, at 7 p.m. The PTO will meet prior to open house at 6:30.

For Eagle Lake Primary School, Principal Dollie Coleman gave a report on campus activities. She stated that progress reports have gone out and a PTO meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, Sept. 13, at 6:30 p.m.

She reported a success with the school's first pep rally held Thursday, Sept. 7. It will be continued, in cooperation with the middle school, on Thursday of each home football game.

Coleman gave a brief summary of the tutorials which will begin after the first six weeks, and about several phonics programs purchased by the Kindergarten department with some grant monies.

Don Wild, principal of Sheridan, announced their PTO meeting to be held Tuesday, Sept. 19, at 6 p.m. He stated his campus' first pep rally was also a success with many parents in attendance. He also gave an update on the celebration given to the students for their TAAS performance. Sheridan is a Recognized Campus.

Michael Lanier, principal of Rice

High School, updated the Board on the conditions of the students in the recent car accidents. He stated that all were doing well and expected to fully recover. He reported that aside from last week's events, the school year was going well.

Dr. Cynthia Saha at the Boot Camp gave a report for her campus. She stated that ground has been broken in the construction of the new TYC facility. Enrollment is at 129 students total with 38 of them being TYC students. She stated that all was going well.

In the order of new business, the budget was amended to include a change in coding for salaries of Special Ed employees of the Coop. The function is now instructional.

The Board considered an offer from Johnson Controls, the company which monitors and supplies air conditioning and heating for all campuses. The company offered to finish out the 10-year contract by finalizing on a payback amount set for each of the next seven years due to projected amount of savings shortfall. After much discussion, the Board decided to table the item and request a presentation from a representative of Johnson Controls.

The investment report was reviewed and approved.

The Board also voted in favor of participating in a Purchasing Coop with the Region 3 service center. It is similar to the coop previously used offered by Region 2. This would allow local businesses to benefit from purchases made by area schools.

Madison Smith, chairman of the Salaries and Benefits Committee, reported on their previous meeting.

The Board approved their recommendations to give all hourly personnel a \$0.20 raise. Administrators will receive the same raise given to the teachers by the district. One thousand four hundred dollars will be divided by 187 days to come up with the daily rate. This will be added according to the additional days the administrators work.

Smith also discussed the possibility of coming up with a new salary schedule for the upcoming school year which would be easier to read.

The Board then approved a Consent for Representation by Walsh, Anderson, Brown, Schulze & Aldridge, P.C. in the area concerning the Shared Service Agreement for the COOP. This involves the districts of Columbus and Weimar as well.

The Board approved the following additions to the substitute list for this year: Tracie Anderson, Antonio Elizondo Jr., Michelle Hill, Sharon Marburger, Susan Peletz, Nancy Pustejovsky and Oralia Supak.

The next scheduled meeting will be Monday, Oct. 9, at 7:30 p.m. in the Administration Building in Altair.

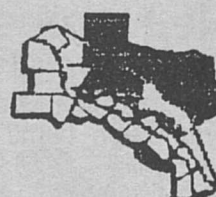
