SUGAR DOESN'T HELP

Is sugar the sweet-coated culprit it's reputed to be? The evidence suggests that too much sugar results only in bad news. Sugar is associated with acne, heart disease, diabetes, obesity and tooth decay. Acid - one of the by-products of mouth bacteria - is the real villain. These bacteria thrive on carbohydrates. Sugar, like starch, is a carbohydrate.

You don't have to cut out sugar entirely to break the cavity-causing cycle. Brushing or rinsing with water within 20 minutes of eating is the best defense... and floss if you can. Also, avoid sticky, sugary foods that leave

hard-to-remove particles.

Moderation is the key. Keep sugar to less than 10% of a normal day's calories. Watch how often you expose your teeth to sugar. It's better to eat one candy bar all at once than to sip sugary soda all day. Substitute cheese or fruit for sweet desserts, eat unsweetened cereal, and drink natural fruit juices or plain water instead of soft drinks. Oh yes - don't forget to brush often.

N. Lake Baptist Missionary Lessons

Quarterly Theme: "Living the Spiritual Life"

First Week: "The Spirit's Role in Salvation". Acts 2:38

The promise that Jesus made in John 16:7, was fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost.

Acts 2:1 called the birth day of the New Testament Church.

There are many gifts given by one spirit. The Holy Spirit himself is a gift.

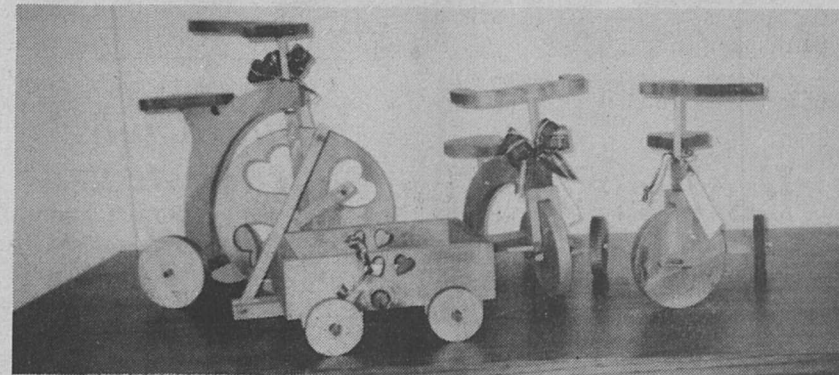
We so often get gifts and talent mixed up. A talent is a natural born ability. Which both can be used in the service of God. Gifts are given by God for the edification of the church.

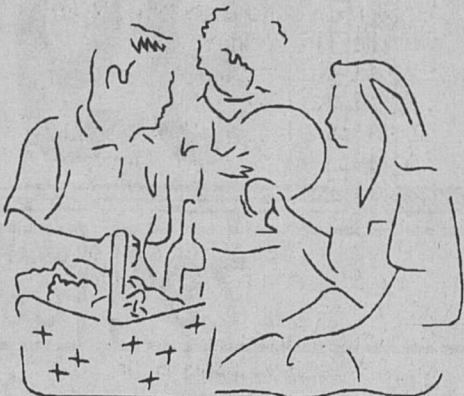

National Reye's Syndrome Week

September 17-23 has been designated National Reye's Syndrome Week. This condition is rare, but when it does occur it can be life-threatening. Although Reye's syndrome is not contagious, the exact cause is unknown. The syndrome typically occurs in children when they are recovering from viral illnesses such as a cold, the flu, or chicken pox. Taking salicylates such as aspirin or bismuth subsalicylate (Pepto-Bismol) during a viral illness has been found to increase the risk of developing the disorder by 35 fold. Therefore The National Reye's Syndrome Foundation and several health-related agencies of the US government recommend that aspirin and aspirin-containing products not be given to children or teenagers who have one of these infections.

Several days after a viral infection, the Reye's Syndrome victim typically develops severe vomiting and becomes disoriented and agitated. He or she may have seizures and go into coma. Intravenous fluids usually are administered. A respirator may be needed if the victim is unconscious. Steroid medicines such as dexamethasone may help reduce brain swelling, thus preventing pressure against the skull and subsequent brain damage.
