I, R.H. "Curly" Wied, Sheriff of Colorado County, am a native of Nada and a life-long resident of Colorado County. A 1970 graduate of Garwood High School, I also attended St. Mary's School in Nada. From 1970-71, I attended Whar-

the United States Air Force from 1972-76. In 1981, I graduated from the Wharton County Jr. College Law Enforcement Academy, where I achieved my law enforcement certification. In acquiring my Advanced Peace Officers License, I have earned numerous hours of training, attending various schools and seminars.

I am a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church, Nada Knights of Columbus, National Sheriff's Association, Sheriff's Association of Texas, Board of Governors for the Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force serving 15 counties, and Board of Governors for the 24th and 25th Judicial Narcotics Task Force serving 5 counties.

My entire career, beginning in 1981, has been with the Colorado County Sheriff's Department. During those 19 years, I have worked my way up through the ranks, serving as a Correctional Officer, Patrol Deputy, Lieutenant Investigator, Chief Deputy, and Sheriff for the past four years.

Since taking office January 1, 1997, I feel I have proven I am competent and capable to serve as your Sheriff. I have made dramatic improvements and changes in law enforcement throughout Colorado County.

Some of those improvements and changes include providing the County with a previously untapped source of income by housing out-ofcounty inmates (which has helped offset the cost of the new jail); increased the number of deputies on patrol in the County (providing a deterrent against crime); implemented a field training officer program; and employed an Auto Theft Agent (at no expense to the taxpayers). Since taking office in 1997, our rate of solving crime has increased substantially.

During my administration, numerous undercover operations, drug raids, and arrests have been made. I have a zero tolerance for drugs. The Sheriff's Department and local police departments working in conjunction with the 24th and 25th Narcotics Task Force have continuously made every effort to curtail drug activity in Colorado County. As long as there is a supply and demand for drugs, you will have drug dealers. Unfortunately, there is no quick fix. I will continue to work hard to enforce drug laws here in Colorado County to the best of my ability.

I have developed a close working relationship with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies. By working in cooperation with these agencies, both the citizens and law enforcement benefit from the large pool of investigative resources which are used to help solve crimes in our community.

In addition, I have improved the working relationship with the schools by maintaining the school resource officer program. This program has helped reduce truancy, ensuring our youth stay in school; safeguard our students against violence, and discourage the use of drugs. My department works closely with School Administrators to ensure the safety of all students.

I would like to ask for your support in the November 7th General Election. I am honest, fair and dedicated and will remain committed to improving law enforcement in Colorado County.
