

The State of Texas developed the program in partnership with NASA and the Texas educational community. It is designed to offer Texas high school students the opportunity to participate in an on-line educational program beginning this fall and features a one-week summer residential experience at NASA Johnson Space Center (JSC) in Houston.

Selected students will take part in a variety of activities including: interactive web-based activities; on-line monitoring; briefings and tours; field trips to the Space Center and Burke-Baker Planetarium; and, a team project at JSC. Eligible students are required to meet the following criteria:

•Currently a high school junior

•U.S. citizen •At least 16 years of age

•Texas resident ·Interested in science, math or

·Able to commit to a one year rela-

tionship with JSC, including one week summer residential experience

·Access to the Internet and e-mail (home, school or public library)

Interested students should contact their high school principal or counselor for more information. High school principals will submit student applications to the state legislators, who will make the final selections.
