When Anthony was asked what

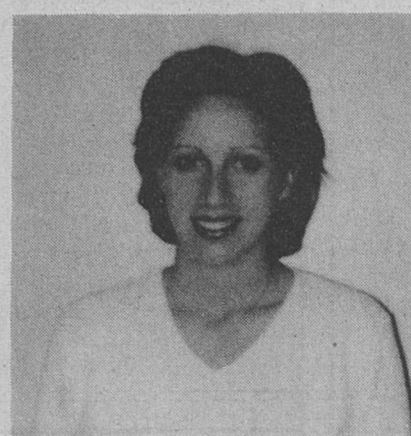
goals he hopes to accomplish this year, he replied, "Well, my main goal is to recover from my injury and play football again."

Meet the Teacher

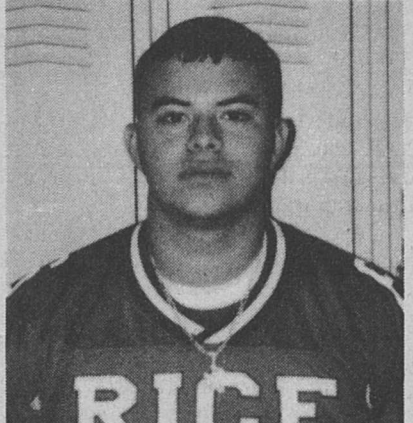

PSAT/PLAN

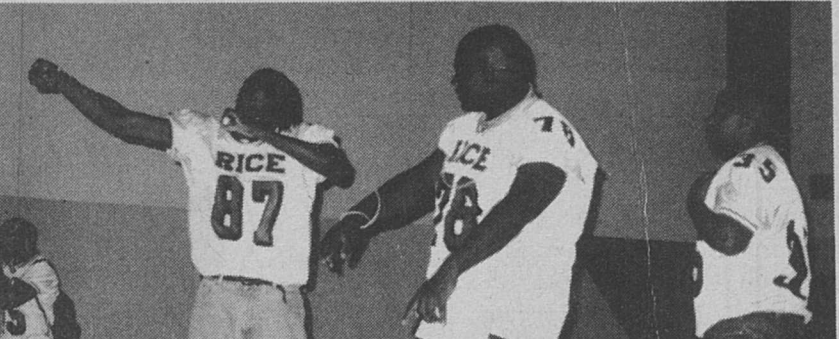

For over five years, Rice has been offering the PSAT and PLAN for sophomores and juniors. The test prepares the students for the SAT and ACT college entrance exams.
A fee of \$9.50 for PSAT and \$8.25 for the PLAN was required.
Fewer students took the PLAN than expected. There was a total of 10 tested for the PLAN and 55 for the

PSAT.
PSAT is also called the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Scores are only used for the juniors; it was more of a practice for the sophomores.
Most of the test results will be back in mid-Dec. When they come back, students will be called in by the guidance counselor, Lee Politsch, to discuss the results.

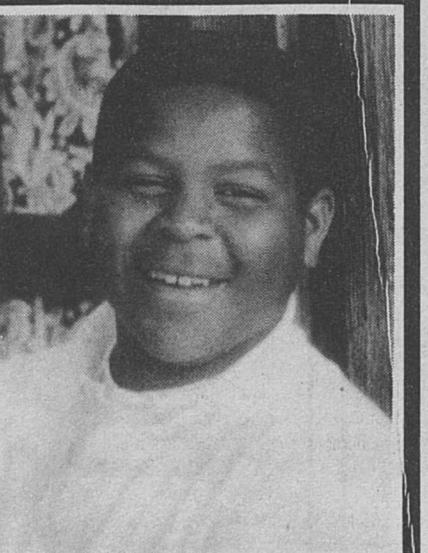
