

# EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

The Eagle Lake Police Department reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Nov. 6.

On Oct. 31, at 8:05 a.m., Officer Michael Krenek was contacted at the Eagle Lake Police Department (ELPD) in reference to a found wallet. The owner of the wallet was located and the property was returned to him.

At 7:05 p.m., some trick-or-treaters flagged down Sgt. Tim Crume in the 100 block of W. State St. A seven-year-old boy had gotten separated from his father and was lost. Sgt. Crume took the boy to his residence, but no one was home. His father arrived at the police station shortly afterwards and the child was released to him.

At 10:11 p.m., Officer Stephen Nelson was dispatched to the My Place Bar in reference to an assault. The complainant advised that another individual hit her. The suspect was contacted and he confessed to the assault, but the victim refused to file charges.

consent; and \$1 to go to the children of the confederacy.

The museum collection will be partly loaned to several sites: up to 10 conserved flags to go to the Museum of the South in Sugarland for a period of one year, during which time the flags may be changed out at the direction of the museum committee; and the book and paper collection to a research library in Midland for up to five years.

A decision on what to do about a museum for all the artifacts is under study by the museum committee, with several suggestions already having been brought forward.

Third Vice-President Diana Foster gave a short report about our C of C Chapter, and received several certificates from the convention. Treasurer, Sonya Saul, gave her report. There were no further officer reports.

Old business was a report from the by-laws committee, chaired by Uzzi,

for consideration and voting upon at the next meeting. Two suggestions were mentioned: that the restriction on opening the Museum only with two members being present be dropped, and that officers be limited to two year terms in succession be adopted. We will vote in Nov.
