Henry W. Bruemmer

Henry W. Bruemmer, 90, of Nada, passed away on Wednesday, November 8, 2000 at his residence.

He was born March 10, 1910, the son of Heinrich Wilhelm and Christine Marie Tiedemann Bruemmer in Ooternodorf, Germany and

relocated to New York in 1955. Bruemmer was in Hilter's Army in World War II that took six years out of his young life, from 1939 to May 8, 1945. He was separated from his wife, son and two daughters.

He drove a motorcycle that carried

officers back and forth to the front lines in France, Rumania, Greece, Yugoslavia and Germany.

Bruemmer marched across Belgium and was on the Islands of Crete, and Isle of Rodhos, Greece. He spent the very cold winter of 1941 in Russia and always said, "One of the happiest days of my life was May 8, 1945, when World War II was over."

After the death of his first wife Maria, he moved to Houston in 1980. He married Clara Leopold Berger in 1983 and moved to Nada.

He was a retired member of Local Union 2090, United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, New York, N.Y. He was a trained artist and crafted cabinetmaker.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his first wife, Maria Meyer Bruemmer; two brothers; and two sisters.
