

EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

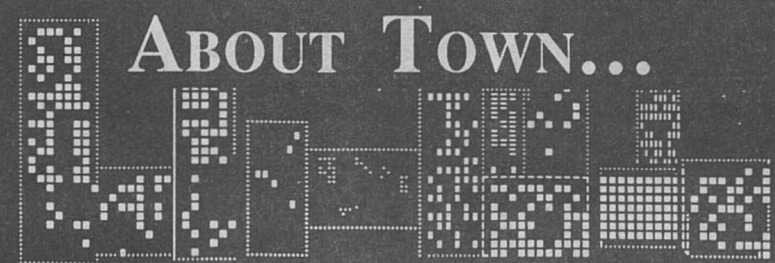

County, Columbus PD make drug arrests

The Colorado County Sheriff's Department, in conjunction with Columbus Police Department, recently conducted a narcotics operation which concluded in the early hours of April 5, 2001.

The investigation was initiated April 4 by Columbus Police Chief Robert Connor and involved several officers.

While conducting surveillance from a roof top, Chief Deputy Schleider observed the suspect deliver marijuana to a 15-year-old juvenile in the 2500 block of Hwy. 71 south in Columbus. The juvenile was arrested on site for possession of marijuana and

resisting arrest.

Schleider obtained a search warrant, along with an arrest warrant from Justice of the Peace Dodie Dungen.

At 1:05 a.m., officers served the search warrant and arrested Miscal Alvarez, 17, of Columbus, for delivery of marijuana to a minor.

Officers also found two scales and several other items of drug paraphernalia in the residence along with a sawed-off rifle, a small amount of marijuana and over \$1,500 in cash.

Assisting in the operation were Sheriff R.H. "Curly" Wied, Sgts. Pavlicek and Zermeno, Deputy Pardo and Officer Lockett.

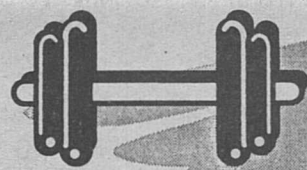

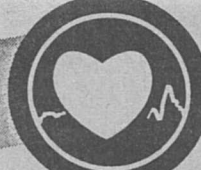
