

Obenhaus, Landrith to wed June 3



Museum adds Dr. Kopecky's dental equipment

Dr. Lewis Kopecky, born in 1906, served his hundreds of patients, first in downtown offices established in Eagle Lake beginning in 1932 and later, after his retirement, in a specially equipped room in his home. He remained professionally active until his death in 1979.

He was a dedicated practitioner, a sterling citizen and active in community affairs. Some of his ancient to semi-modern office equipment has been long hidden from public view.

Recently, through the generosity of Robert Griffith, this paraphernalia has been dusted off, assembled and placed in the Prairie Edge Museum.


