rates play a significant role in reduced healthcare services for women.

Out of 254 counties in Texas, 156 counties do not have an Obstetricians or Gynecologists, said Rep. Cook. That accounts for nearly one million women in Texas who do not have proper access to doctors specializing in treating women's health needs, said Cook. The Omnibus Women's Equal Health Care Act changes the system to help increase the availability of women's healthcare services throughout Texas, explained Cook.
