CCSD investigations

Aug. 10, at 9 p.m., Colorado County Sheriff's Department (CCSD) Sgt. Jason Pavlicek was dispatched to 708 mile marker in reference to a subject lying in the roadway.

Upon investigating the call, Pavlicek made contact with a transient.

Upon questioning the transient, Pavlicek was told by the subject he had observed what appeared to be a body of a dummy in a creek approximately one mile back.

Sgt. Pavlicek went to the reported location and found the body of a deceased Hispanic male laying in the weeds.

Sheriff's Department investigators made the scene and conducted a thorough investigation, assisted by Texas Ranger Brian Taylor.

Judge Francis Truchard ordered an autopsy and the body was transported to the Travis County Medical Examiners Office by Henneke Funeral Home.

The results of the autopsy concluded the deceased, identified as Jose Quintanilla Andrade, 37, of Houston, did not succumb to foul play but heat stroke.

The CCSD is currently investigating vandalism of the newly constructed bridge on Venghaus-George

Road in Precinct 3.

The incident occurred the night of Aug. 11, 2001. Actor(s) using black spray paint, painted initials and nicknames on the bridge, dated 8-11-01.

There are two suspects in the case. The investigation continues.

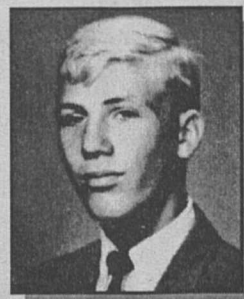

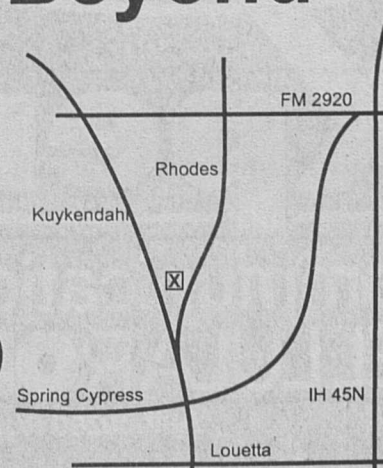

Views On Dental Health

RUBBER PICS

Have you ever wondered what that little rubber pic was doing, sticking out at the bottom of your toothbrush handle? If so, you must be someone else's patient. It's an "interdental stimulator". It massages gums and helps firm them against disease.

As periodontal disease becomes more of a worry, people are gaining new respect for that rubber tip at the end of the toothbrush. The stimulator doesn't replace brushing and flossing, but it's great for rebuilding the triangle of gum between teeth that's often flattened by disease and oral surgery. Also, it's handy for freeing trapped

food. Place the tip between two teeth at a 45 degree angle to the gum, press down on the gum three times and bring the stimulator up between the teeth.

Ask your dentist for a stimulator that fits into a wall-mounted toothbrush holder. If your dentist doesn't have one handy, or you're flush with a dollar or so, check the local drugstore. Then put it to good use.
