

LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORTS

The Colorado County Sheriff's Department reported the following calls and cases for the period ending Aug. 10.

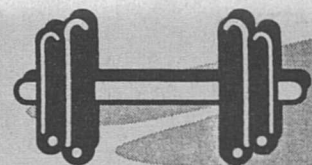
