

# EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

The Eagle Lake Police Department (ELPD) reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Sept. 3.

Aug. 28, a 30-year old El Campo resident, Christopher Gaskin, turned himself in to Sgt. Tim Crume at the ELPD after he had been notified by Crume that a misdemeanor assault

warrant had been issued for his arrest.

The warrant was obtained from Justice of the Peace Pct. 4 Larry Du-lany. Gaskin was charged with the misdemeanor assault after the conclusion of an investigation in which Gaskin allegedly assaulted a 15-year-old male from Falfurrias, Texas.

Aug. 29, at 7:53 a.m., Chief Keith

Webb was called to a disturbance in the 500 block of E. Main St. The caller claimed the suspect had left the scene, and he was not wanted on the property. The suspect was later contacted and issued a criminal trespass warning.

At 1:40 p.m., Sgt. Crume responded to a burglary of a habitation at 414 E. Union St. The suspect(s) entered the residence through the side door between 5:30 and 6:30 a.m. A resident woke up and the suspect(s) fled the scene without taking any property. The case is under investigation.

At 4 p.m., officers arrested/detained and processed a 14-year-old male juvenile for the Aug. 25 burglary of the Video-2-Go Store. The juvenile's parents brought the 14-year-old to the police station voluntarily.

All the property taken in the theft was recovered and returned. The burglary of a building offense is a state jail felony, and the case has now been turned over to the Colorado County Juvenile Probation Department. The juvenile was released to his parents.

At 4:30 p.m., officers arrested/detained and processed two 10-year-old male juveniles for the second degree felony offense of burglary of a habitation. The house burglarized on Aug. 19 was in the 200 block of E. Davitt St. The case has now been turned over to the Colorado County Juvenile Probation Department.

Parents voluntarily brought their 10-year-olds to the police department and, after they were processed, they were released back to their parents.

At 4:35 p.m., Ryan Beane of Columbus called Chief Webb at the police department to report that over a year ago he had paid Andrew Magninat, the owner of the closed taxidermy business "Unlimited Animal Artistry", in full for him to mount a set of antlers. Beane said he has attempted to locate Magninat numerous times and has been unsuccessful. A report was taken.

Aug. 30, at 10 a.m., Chief Webb and City Manager Ron Holland attended a building dedication ceremony at the Colorado County Juvenile Boot Camp. A newly completed facility housing female commitments to the Texas Youth Commission was being dedicated and named after the recently deceased facility administrator, Dalton Sherrill. Many county and area dignitaries attended the ceremony, were given tours of the facility and later provided lunch ca-

tered by Austin's Barbecue.

Aug. 31, at 11:45 a.m., Sgt. Crume and Officer Rosalinda Perez were dispatched to an unconscious male at the My Place Bar at 400 Beaks St. The officers arrived and discovered L.C. Montgomery having a seizure. EMS Unit Medic 3 was dispatched to the scene and Montgomery was transported to the hospital. Bystanders told the officers Montgomery was cleaning the bar when he had the seizure.

At 12:55 p.m., a complainant contacted Sgt. Crume and Officer Perez at the ELPD and stated she and her boyfriend had been arguing. No criminal offense had occurred and the complainant was transported to a friend's house.

At 2:30 p.m., Officer Perez and the Eagle Lake Volunteer Fire Department (ELVFD) responded to a house fire in the 700 block of Burns St. Officer Perez arrived and contacted the homeowner.

Perez and the ELVFD located the source of the smoke in a breaker box. The damage was minor and there were no injuries.

At 4:50 p.m., a theft complainant contacted Lt. Clem Johnson at the ELPD claiming some tools were taken from a vehicle which had been parked in a driveway in the 1300 block of E. State St. The case is under investigation.

At 5:50 p.m., Officer Bryan Lasley was dispatched to a disturbance at a residence in the 500 block of S. Lake Ave. The disturbance was verbal in nature. One of the subjects was issued a criminal trespass warning for the property.

At 9:20 p.m., Officer Lasley was dispatched to an apartment in the 400 block of W. Prairie St. in reference to a burglary of a habitation. The suspect apparently entered the apartment

through a window and had left the scene prior to the resident returning home. A suspect has been developed and the case is under investigation.

Sept. 1 at 12:05 a.m., Officer Lasley was dispatched to an intoxicated male in the 300 block of S. Austin Road. Twenty-one-year-old Norman Henderson III was located and arrested for public intoxication, a Class C misdemeanor.

At 10:47 a.m., Officer Perez responded to a family violence call at a residence in the 300 block of S. Lake Ave. Joe Allen Davidson was arrested for Class C misdemeanor family violence.

Sept. 2, Officer Lasley responded to a fight in progress at the J's Tree House Bar on Glen Flora Rd. All the suspects involved in the fight fled the scene prior to the officer's arrival. No injuries were reported.

At 10:47 a.m., Officer Perez was dispatched to criminal mischief of a vehicle at a residence in the 500 block of Norris St. The suspect(s) entered the garage and punctured three of the vehicle's tires, deflating them. The complainant refused to file charges.

At 1:06 p.m., Officer Perez was dispatched to the 600 block of E. Main St. in reference to a verbal disturbance. One of the parties involved left the scene. Perez contacted the caller who claimed the other subject approached her and started the argument. Perez located the other subject; no criminal charges were filed.

Sept. 3, at 2:12 a.m., Officer Lasley was called to a criminal mischief at a residence in the 700 block of Partridge Lane. Suspects damaged a vehicle while it was parked in the driveway of the residence.

The resident's son drove up on the suspects, causing them to flee the scene. Family members gave chase

out of town and into Austin County. The suspects discharged firearms at the family members who were following them.

Austin County Sheriff's Department was notified of the chase and were able to identify suspects in the case.

Tuesday, Sept. 4, the ELPD was notified that one was in custody under several felony charges. No one was injured during the chase or the shootings. The case is under investigation.

At 8:51 a.m., Officer Perez responded to a criminal mischief of a vehicle at a residence in the 400 of Norris St. The suspects broke out two of the vehicle's windows.

The case is being examined to determine if it is related to the previous criminal mischief call and is under investigation.

At 5:15 p.m., Officer Perez was dispatched to a verbal dispute at a residence in the 400 block of S. Austin Road. Perez arrived and learned the dispute was between neighbors. One of the subjects was issued a criminal trespass warning. No other police action was taken.

At 7:31 p.m., Lt. Johnson and EMS Unit Medic 3 responded to an auto pedestrian accident in the intersection of Third St. and East C Street.

Jo Fuentes was traveling south bound on Third St. in an Oldsmobile when a six-year-old child ran out into the street and was struck by the vehicle. The child was transported to Rice Medical Center for minor injuries.

Fuentes was issued a citation for not having a driver's license and the vehicle's owner, Gregory Frazier, was issued a citation for permitting an unlicensed person to operate a motor vehicle.

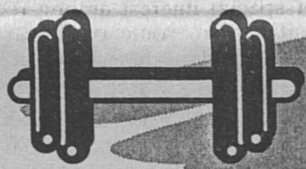
