

LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORTS

The Eagle Lake Police Department (ELPD) reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Sept. 10.

2002, in preparation for the next session of the Texas Legislature in 2003.

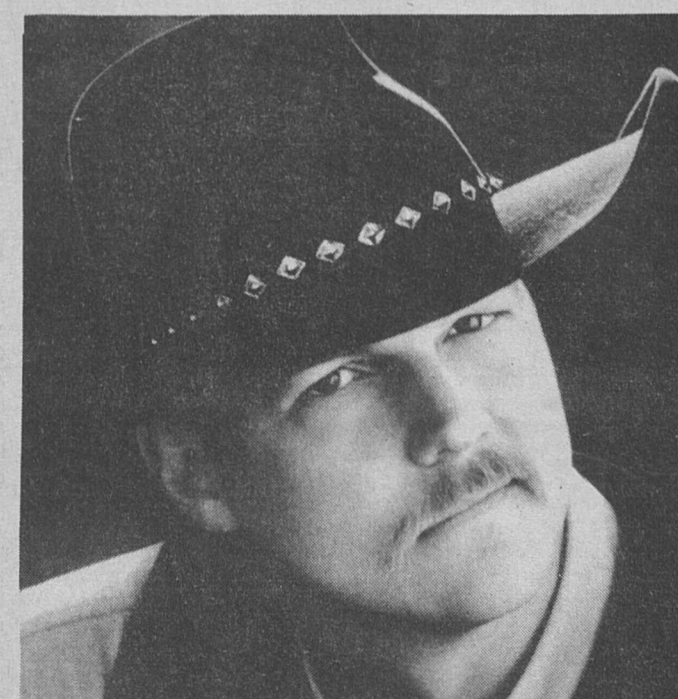
