Why should you register your

Registration is for your protection. The district will be able to notify you of activities in your area such as hearings on non-exempt drilling permits, water level declines and warnings of pollution spills.

Generally, the district also needs the technical information on your well in order to be able to conduct meaningful analysis of the aquifer. Most of the data needed is on the water well driller's form that is currently being filed in Austin but will be filed with the district if it is approved. Your participation will correct any omissions of or errors on reports for existing wells.

All wells capable of producing 25,000 gpd or more or on less than 10 acres of land are then called "nonexempt wells" and will need permits. These are the wells whose production can be limited by a GCD.

Non-exempt wells existing at the time of formation of the district are "grandfathered" into the district. That means they cannot be refused a per-



If you can easily invert your feet so the soles face each other, you are at greater risk of ankle sprains. Wearing stable, low-heeled shoes and elastic ankle supports, especially during physical activities, can help prevent sprains. When you suffer a sprain, treatment is based on the injury's severity. If you can hop on the foot after a few minutes, you can resume normal activity. The R.I.C.E. method of rest, ice, compression, and elevations, plus an immediate doctor's visit, are recommended in more severe sprains.

Limited Ballot

1) The Election Code authorizes voting a limited ballot after changing County of residence.

Eligibility

1) After changing residence to another County, a person is eligible to vote a limited ballot by personal appearance or by mail if:

a. The person would have been eligible to vote in the County of former residence on election day if still residing in the County.

b. The date of election is not more than 90 days after the new residence was established. A voter registration for the person in the County of new residence is not effective on or before election day.

2) A person is not eligible to vote a limited ballot by mail unless in addition to satisfying the eligibility requirements prescribed above, the person is eligible to vote early by mail under the standard early mail rules.
