Gramm's seat is up for grabs

When U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm announced he would not seek re-election, for Texas politicians it was like the music stopping in a cakewalk.

One of those who thought about a run for the vacant seat was Land Commissioner David Dewhurst. But he's changed his mind.

Shortly after Gov. Rick Perry named him as chairman of the Governor's Task Force on Homeland Security, Dewhurst announced he would nor, which likely will pit him against Democrat John Sharp in Nov. 2002.

Republican Attorney General John Cornyn is going after Gramm's seat. San Antonio Congressman Henry Bonilla, also a Republican, had been considering the race, but has said he won't run now.

The only announced Republican dent. candidate to replace Cornyn as the state's most visible lawyer is Greg Abbott, a former state Supreme Court
