

LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORTS

The Colorado County Sheriff's Department reported the following calls and cases for the period ending Sept. 21.

Sunday, Sept. 9, at 4:30 a.m., Deputy Leal was advised of a hit-and-run accident on I-10 west bound. The vehicle was located in Weimar and one subject, Justin Walker, 23, of Houston, was arrested for possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The subject later posted a \$25,000 bond. The case will be forwarded to the County Attorney for prosecution. If convicted on the felony charge, Mokbel could face deportation.

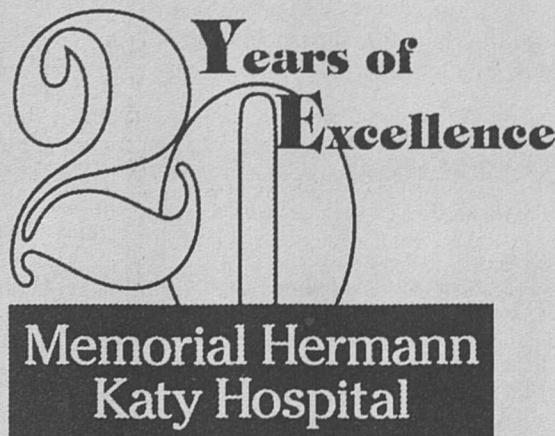
