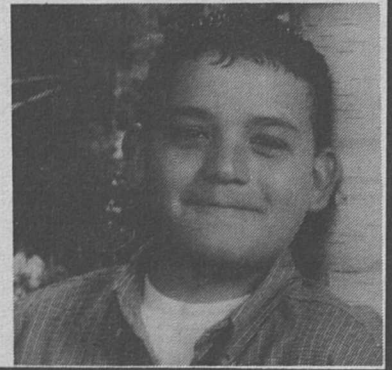

Foot Facts

INGROWN TOENAILS

Ingrown toenails occur when the corners or sides of nails grow into the surrounding skin. The area often becomes irritated, red, and swollen. Rubbing against shoes, socks, or bed sheets can exacerbate symptoms. Soaking the foot in warm soapy or salt water, then applying antiseptic and a bandage may help mild cases. For chronic conditions, a permanent correction is often advised. A podiatrist can perform either a partial chemical matrixectomy or a partial surgical matrixectomy. With the chemical procedure, the doctor removes part of the nail and uses a chemical treatment to permanently kill nail growth cells. The surgical procedure involves partial nail removal and surgical removal of the nail growth cells under local anesthesia.

Ingrown toenails very often occur from improper trimming, but poor foot structure, heredity, injury, and infection can be contributing factors. 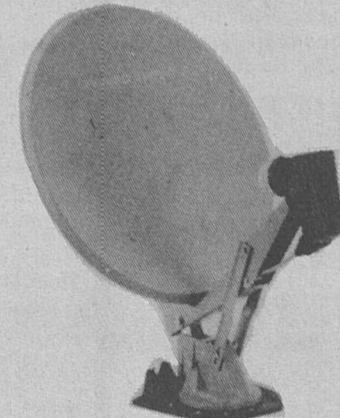
