

EAGLE LAKE POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Eagle Lake Police Department (ELPD) reported the following calls and cases for the week ending Oct. 29.

Oct. 23, at 12:51 p.m., Officer Steve Nelson was called to a residence in the 500 block of East C Street in reference to a criminal trespass. The suspect left the scene prior to the officer's arrival, but was later located and issued a criminal trespass warning for the property.

At 3:19 p.m., a complainant contacted Chief Keith Webb at the ELPD reporting a criminal mischief which had occurred in the 700 block of South Austin Road a few months ago. The case is under investigation.
