Texas Recycles Day is Nov. 15

Everyone knows the term recycling, but is everyone doing his or her part to recycle? The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) and Keep Texas Beautiful have come together to co-sponsor this year's 8th Annual Texas Recycles Day. And they want everyone to know how easy it is to make a positive difference to our environment by becoming an active participant in this year's event.

This year's theme, Care for the Air... Recycle, addresses one of the most important environmental issues facing each one of us. There's no arguing with the facts that say we are in midst of rising global temperatures that are raising sea levels, changing precipitation and contributing to other local climate conditions.

According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), global warming is also changing regional climates that can alter forests, crop yields, and water supplies. It could also threaten human health, and harm birds, fish and many types of important ecosystems.

A recent report conducted by a committee of the National Academies' National Research Council (issued June 6, 2001) summed up science's current understanding of global climate change by characterizing the global warming trend over the last 100 years and examining what may be in store for the 21st century. One of the conclusions reached was that greenhouse gases are accumulating in the earth's atmosphere, causing surface temperatures to rise.

The committee also said hazardous greenhouse gases most likely occurred in the last 50 years. The greenhouse gas of most concern is carbon dioxide (fuels)

Other significant greenhouse gases include methane, nitrous oxide (produced when we burn fuel), water vapor tropospheric ozone (harmful low ozone found near the earth's surface that is known to irritate the lungs of humans, animals and plant life), chlorofluorocarbons.

Now what does this mean to us and how can we, as individuals, make a difference?

First, we must realize if each person makes one or two small changes, those changes collectively benefit our neighborhood, our city, the nation and the world.

Here's a few things we can do, not only on Texas

Recycles Day, but each day after. ·Carpool, vanpool or take the bus.

•Lower the temperature on your hot water tank to 120°. ·Buy food and other products with reusable or recyclable packaging or reduced packaging.
