Bush not the first with 'Lone Star hospitality'

When Russian President Vladimir Putin visited President George W. Bush's 1,600-acre Prairie Chapel ranch last week, the world spotlight briefly centered on Crawford, Texas.

Unmentioned in any of the Texas news media coverage of Putin's visit, and barely mentioned even by the national media, was that a Texan named Lyndon Baines Johnson perfected this brand of Lone Star political hospitality more than 40 years ago.

In April 1961, for instance, then Vice President Johnson hosted West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer at Johnson's 438-acre ranch on the Pedernales near Johnson City.

following the assassination of John F. Kennedy years ago this Thanksgiving, a succession of other world figures were wooed and fed on the LBJ Ranch during his presidency.

With the Cold War seemingly ever in danger of heating up in the 1960s, LBJ never got to drive Nikita Khrushchev around his ranch in his white

But the ranch guest list is virtually a Who's Who of who was who in the Kennedy-Johnson era.

Who knows how sneaky the post-Communism Russian intelligence service is, but perhaps one of their operatives studied a book just published by Texas A&M University Press, 'LBJ's Texas White House." Medicines That Help Scleroderma

Systemic scleroderma occurs worldwide and affects all races. But this condition is more frequent and severe in young black women. It is characterized by excessive scarring and damage to several different organs of the body. The first noticeable symptom is swelling of the fingertips. Damage to the esophagus may lead to heartburn, swallowing difficulties, and weight loss. Scar tissue in the liver can lead to jaundice. Facial skin may tighten, often leading to an inability to change facial expressions. Calcium deposits may form on the fingers and at the joints. Scarring can become fatal in the lung and kidneys.

Medicines can help relieve symptoms and reduce organ damage. Nonsteroidal antiinflammatory drugs such as rofecoxib (Vioxx) are used to help reduce swelling and pain. Steroids like methylprednisolone (Medrol) are used for severe pain and weakness. Famotidine (Pepcid) can help heartburn. Antibiotics like tetracycline prevent bacterial overgrowth in the damaged intestine. Penicillamine (Cuprimine) slows skin thickening and may delay additional organ involvement. Enalapril (Vasotec) can help treat kidney disease and high blood pressure

THE BEST WAY TO FLOSS

eeded to help you remove the bacteria from your teeth and gums that causes tooth decay. Here are some pointers on flossing technique.

After you've given your teeth a good brushing, take about 18 inches of floss. Wrap the ends around your middle fingers to take up the slack. Then use your thumbs to guide the floss between and ready to switch to the lower teeth, use your index fingers to guide the floss.

The floss should be held tightly to keep it taught. But you should use gentle motions once it's inserted beween your teeth. Don't force it or pull 3525.
