Some of the other directives from the National Arborists Association, Inc.'s standards, (approved nationally for The industry by the American National Standards Institute [ANSI]) and embraced by Texas and most state transportation departments, include:

"When pruning, strive to prenumber of branches necessary to cessive clearance."

Mind you, readers, these are citizens in all aspects of horticulture, TxDot's Pruning and Brush Management Guidelines requested in Chapter 5 of its manual for its highway right of way, adjacent to private properties, such as the Loessin-Whorton apply to city streets.

The City of Eagle Lake can only prevent more damages most certainly ahead for its trees by enacting just what Columbus did in May 2002, ' with its stringent, tough "Tree Preservation Ordinance"
