

# LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORTS

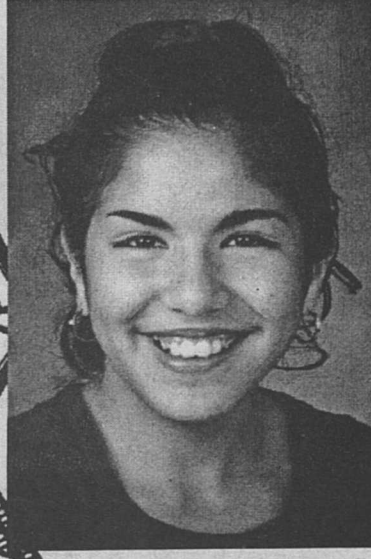
