#### Water Conservation **Districts**

By Benard Mitchell, Colorado County Extension Agent, Agri/NR

The purpose of water districts is to preserve, protect and manage the aquifer, not just quantity but also the quality of water that is available. Enabling legislation was provided in 1929 and the first water conservation district (WCD) was formed in 1951 on the High Plains.

Today, over two-thirds of the state has WCDs that have been established or proposed. All water below the soil surface belongs to the state of Texas.

Texas is the only state having the "right to capture". Other states are regulated by Natural Resource Commissions. In Texas we can pump water to the surface and use it for do-(See Water, Page 3)

Savvy Note: A different set of rules applies to people receiving Social Security disability benefits or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments. Also, a different set of rules from self-employment are counted. In either case, non-work income such as applies to most work performed outside the U.S. ment earnings, interest, pensions, an-

Here's the savvy Social Security formula to determine how much your nuities and capital gains is not benefit must be reduced:

•If you're under full retirement age when you begin receiving your Social Security benefits, \$1 in benefits will be deducted for each \$2 you earn year have already earned more than above the annual limit. For 2002, that the yearly earnings limit before they limit is \$11,280.

•In the year you reach full retire- that applies to earnings for one year, ment age (currently age 65), \$1 in ben-usually the first year of retirement. efits will be deducted for each \$3 you earn above a different limit, but only Social Security check for any whole for the months before the month you reach the full retirement age. For 2002, this limit is \$30,000. Starting with the month you reach full retirement age, you can receive your full benefits with no limit on your earnings.

Sound complicated??? IT IS!!! Here are some savvy examples of how the rules would affect you:
