## Seniors should reaffirm ties on 9-11 anniversary

Seniors citizens who are still plagued with fearful thoughts brought on by the Sept. attacks of a year ago should prepare ahead for negative television images, said a Baylor College of Medicine geriatrician.

"Turn off the television and the bad news," said Dr. Robert Roush of

Baylor's Huffington Center on Aging. "Pick up a book or go see a movie. Don't dwell on the rerun images of last year's attacks."

Roush recommends taking the occasion of the one-year anniversary of the attacks this month as an opportunity to reaffirm relationships with family, friends and loved ones.

"Make contact with them and ask them how they are doing, tell them how much they mean to you," he said. "Any time you can make a person feel secure, you may have met a very important human need."

Roush said many of the fears older adults have in regards to terrorism are not for themselves but for their loved ones.

"Older individuals should communicate their concerns with their loved

Music fans in the know will all be making a beeline for the Colorado County Fair, Friday, Sept. 13, when Bobby Pulido takes the stage at the entertainment pavilion.

Born Robert Pulido Jr., April 25, 1973 in Edinburg, Bobby has successfully blended smooth vocals, smart song selection and a solid band to rise to the top of the charts.

Despite initial criticism that he was riding on the hard-earned reputation of his famous father, the venerable Tejano pioneer Roberto Pulido, the younger Pulido patiently honed his vocal talents and wisely assembled a smart management team the key to any successful group.

Pulido began playing with a local mariachi band while he was in high school and soon afterward, started playing in his father's band, Los Clasicos, filling in with sax and vocals.

His break came when EMI released a compilation album, "Branding Iron," in 1994, on which he was featured in a duet with his father called, "Contigo."

Then just 20-years-old, Pulido dropped his business management studies at St. Mary's University in San Antonio and went full time into music.

Pulido debuted in Sept. 1995 with his CD, "Desvelado" which, according to EMI, sold more than 100,000 copies and included three songs written by Pulido. His singles "Desvelado" and "No Sé Por Qué" both broke into the Billboard Hot Latin Tracks chart.

In 1996, Pulido took time out-but not for long-from his sky-rocketing career to get married. In Sept. of the same year he released his second CD, "Enseñame," including singles, "Enseñame" and "Se Murio de Amor," which also landed him on the Billboard of Latin Tracks chart.

Since that time, Pulido has produced "Llegaste a Mi Vida" and won five of the 12 Tejano Music Awards including best male entertainer, best male vocalist, best Tejano crossover and best album, "Llegaste a Mi Vida."

Earlier this year, Pulido released, "Bobby" and already critics are praising this CD as his best. Pulido will share cuts from "Bobby" and requested favorites under the entertainment pavilion, 10 p.m. to midnight, Sept. 13.

The junior sale will be held starting at 2 p.m.

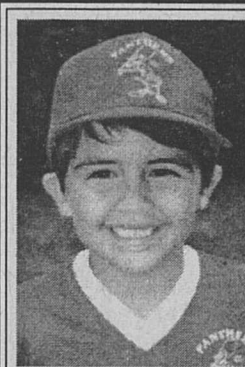
Music by Gary Allan and Texas Unlimited, as well as CPRA Rodeo and Calf Scramble are being held Saturday night.
