has prompted Wharton County Junior College (WCJC) to increase its marketing efforts to attract students industry with support on its process to its associate in applied science degree program in process technology in Bay City.

The college currently has about 35 as a valuable resource for providing students registered for the program's fall classes and hopes to recruit more knowledge which in turn reduces before the beginning of the fall semester.

According to Dr. Kirby Lowery, Ph.D., WCJC division chair of math and science, graduates of the program can expect to earn an annual salary somewhere between \$30,000 to \$50,000.

Process technicians and operators ing can also see their salaries rise with experience over a five-year period to WCJCs associate in applied science upwards of \$80,000. Since chemical plants operate on a 24-hour basis, those employed in process technology core academic courses such as Math.

'Currently, the number of job openings in process technology is greater than the national average for nost jobs," said Lowery.

'Process technology offers rewarding careers to those willing to degree for those intending to transfer live in a coastal area," explained Lowery. "This career is ideal for someone who has an aptitude for those seeking degrees in specialized chemistry and mechanical applica- technical and vocational fields, and tions.'

WCJC began offering a degree in process technology in 1998. To date employment. 19 students have graduated from the program and all have found work in their field.

The program was established in Bay City at the Tessenger Engineering Building in order to house one of the program's most unique features, a miniature process skid chemical plant. According to Lowery, the model provides students with valuable hands-on experience by allowing them to operate valves and controllers.

The process technology program is designed to prepare students for advanced technology in the area of process operations at petrochemical and refining companies and other industries. Students are provided both the academic and technical competencies required for the rapidly changing technology demands of the industry. Students learn theory as well as hands-on experience.

'We're very proud of our program and especially the well-trained graduates we send out to area companies," said Lowery. "All of our instructors
