

LAW ENFORCEMENT

Two teenagers lead officers on 24-mile chase

Friday, Oct. 4, at approximately 9:35 p.m., two 14-year-old juveniles (male and female) from Bryan were taken into custody after leading Colorado County Sheriff's deputies and Department of Public Safety on a 24-mile pursuit.

The pursuit began at about 8:58 p.m. when a motorist phoned 911 to report a possible drunk driver traveling I-10 west bound near the 702 mile marker. The motorist relayed the description of the vehicle and license plate number to communications. A computer check listed the vehicle as stolen from Bryan.

Officers set up for the vehicle at the 695 mile marker to initiate a traffic stop.

Sheriff R.H. "Curly" Wied, Deputies Basco, Leal and Green and DPS Trooper Heather Krueger intercepted the vehicle at that location with Krueger activating the units emergency lights in an attempt to stop the vehicle. The driver ignored the trooper and accelerated.

Units pursued the suspect and, at times reached speeds in excess of 100

miles per hour, all the while the suspect attempted to ram the patrol units.

The suspect avoided spike strips just west of Weimar and continued west, exiting at Hwy. 90, running through the intersection at a high rate of speed and striking mailboxes and a guardrail.

The suspect re-entered I-10 west toward Schulenburg and exited at U.S. 77, striking a guardrail and narrowly missing a passing motorist in the intersection.

The suspect got back onto I-10 west, traveling approximately 2.2 miles when the left front tire blew out. The officers were then able to stop the suspect by means of a rolling roadblock. The juveniles were immediately taken into custody.


They were charged for evading arrest or detention and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle and detained at the Colorado County Boot Camp. They also face charges in Bryan.

Agencies also involved in the chase were the Weimar and Schulenburg Police Departments and the Fayette County Sheriff's Office.
