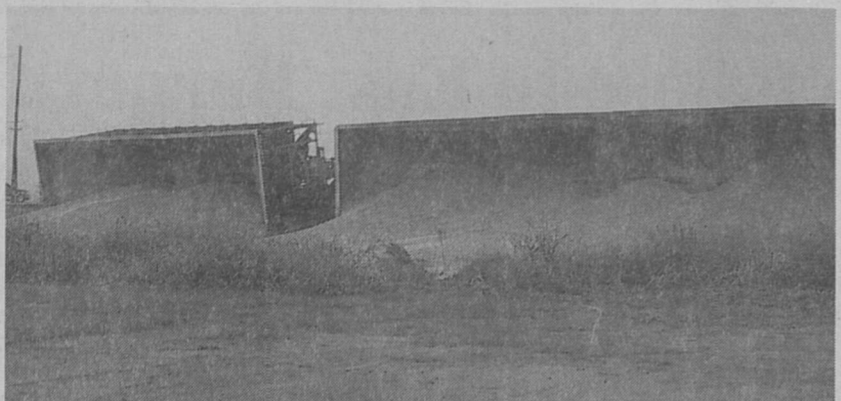
At 6:50 p.m., Sgt. Nelson was dis-

CIVIC GARDEN CLUB

I know this autumn weather is wonderful and everyone is feeling ambitious.

This is good because there are many garden chores that need to be done, also many garden pleasures to enjoy.

Check your camellias for scale and spray before Oct. 15 if you have this problem.

Shape up your azaleas by pruning any long scraggly branches down to the base of the plant and they will bud out at the cut.

Check the acidity and correct if necessary by applying part agricultural sulphur and two parts copperas. Lightly apply around the edge of the plants and gently hand water into the soil, being careful not to disturb shallow roots.

Don't use high nitrogen fertilizer on anything except winter vegetables. Fertilize spring-blooming shrubs with four parts super phosphate with one part sulphur of potash, carefully mixed and sparingly sprinkled away from the trunk. Water-in thoroughly.

If your beds are ready and have at least six hours of sun along with really good drainage, you can start planting vegetables and herbs.

Vegetables will taste better and have fewer insect and disease problems if they grow fast.

To hurry the growth process once the plants are rooted in good, side

dress once a month with rotted manure, 8-24-24 or a nitrogen fertilizer, being careful not to let the fertilizer touch the plants. Water well.

I love growing herbs, especially since I have discovered the ones that do well for me and the ones that don't.

I like to water them in the early morning and especially the evening and just drink in and enjoy the rich aromas.

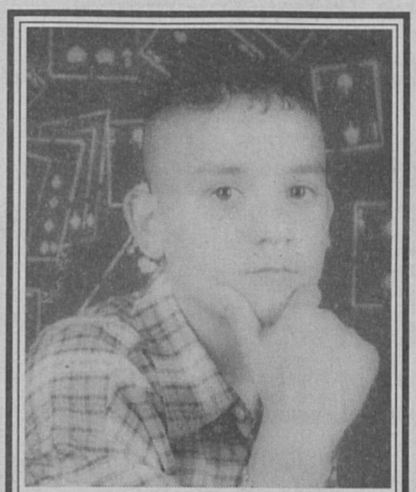
Herbs are not always pretty, so plant some marigolds or nasturtiums if you like.

Some of the herbs that are easier to grow are rosemary and sage along with the many varieties of basil and mints.

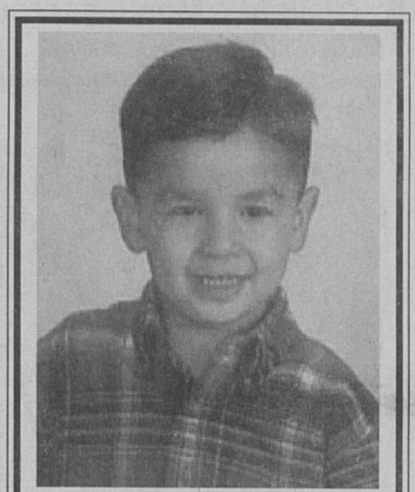
Dill and sweet marjoram, fennel and chives have all done well for me.
