CHANGE YOUR TOOTHBRUSH
 You may not know it, but your toothbrush may be a source of recurrent infection unless you replace it regularly. A University of Oklahoma study showed that people who changed their toothbrushes frequently - every two weeks - recovered from colds, sore throats and some oral problems quicker than people who kept using the same toothbrush month after month. The study found that toothbrushes can become contaminated with various germs after about a month. The organisms found on the brushes were those, "found in pneumonia, stomach ulcers, strep throat, sinus disease, and upset stomach". People with chronic sinus disease were greatly improved when they started to change their brushes regularly. The study concluded that brushes should be replaced at least monthly, but more frequently during illness.

The same reasoning would suggest that dentures should be thoroughly cleaned frequently, particularly during an illness and when undergoing gum treatment.
