

LAW ENFORCEMENT

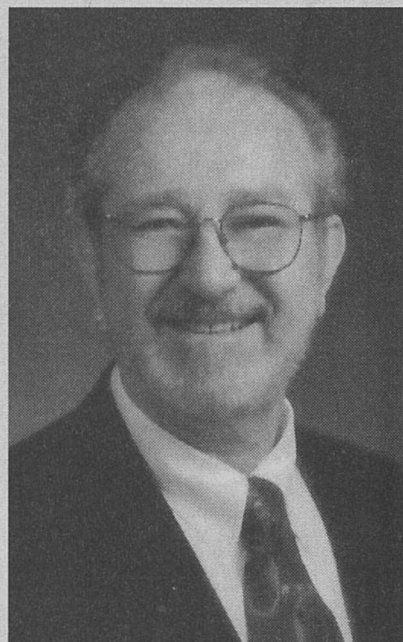

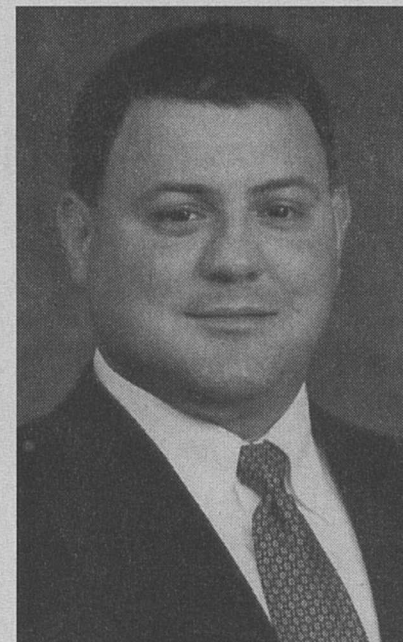

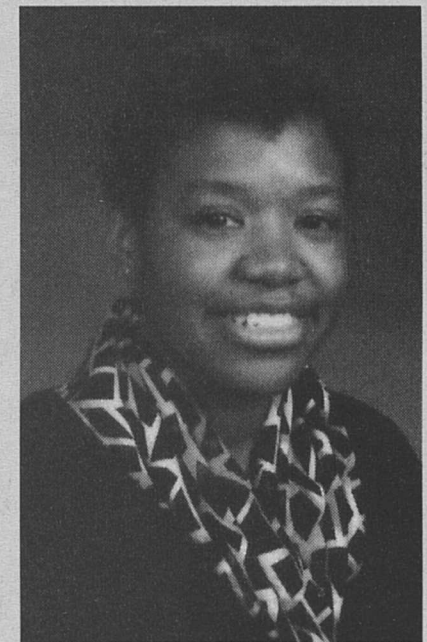

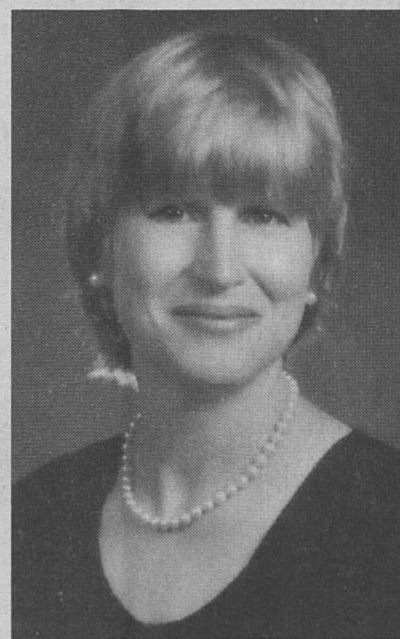

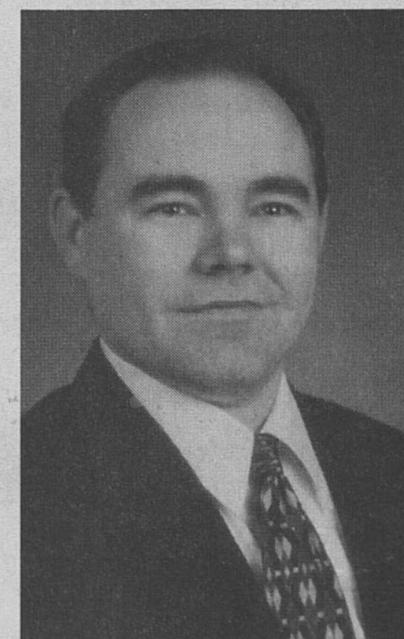

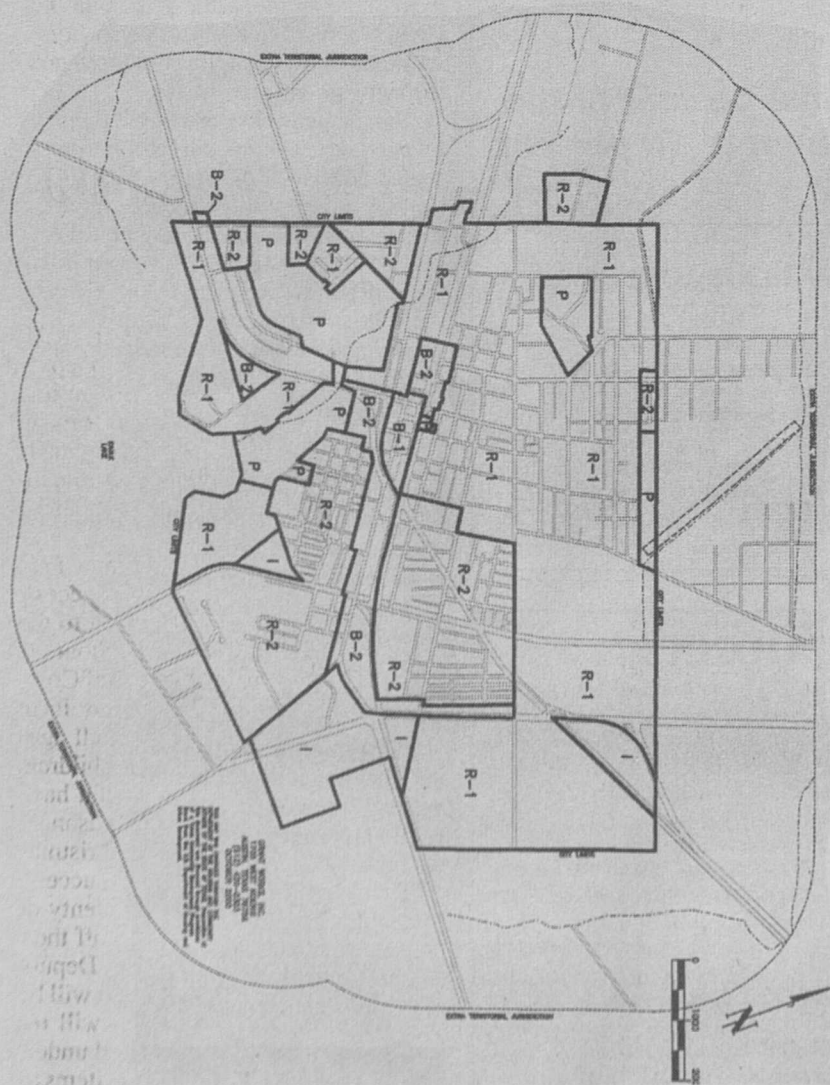
