Defensive Players of the Game were Jason Godley and Joe Cooper. Jason had eight tackles, one caused fumble, one fumble recovery and played outstanding pass defense. Joe had 12 tackles and one tackle for a loss.

Other defensive stalwarts were Anthony Palmer, eight tackles, one sack and one fumble recovery; Zack Kloss, six tackles, one sack and one caused fumble; King, five tackles, one tackle for a loss and one blocked kick return for a touchdown; and, Jeramie Williams, five tackles and two passes broken up.

Gatorade Player of the Week goes to Michael Spears. He had 145 yards rushing, one punt return for 29 yards and two tackles on defense.

The Raiders finish the regular season at 7-3 for the year, 4-1 in district.

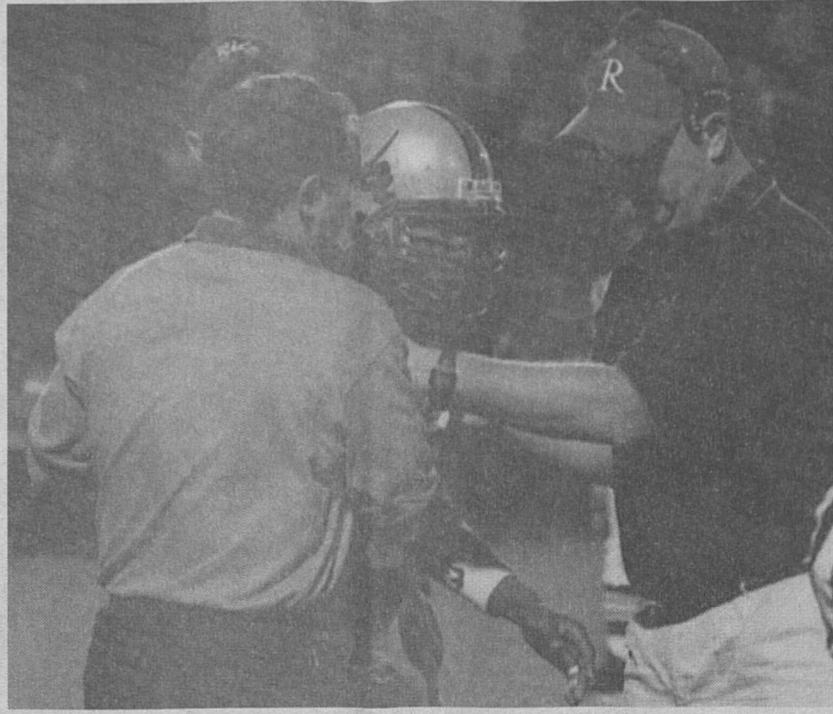

Rice plays Cuero this Saturday, Nov. 16 at Victoria Memorial Stadium at 2 p.m.

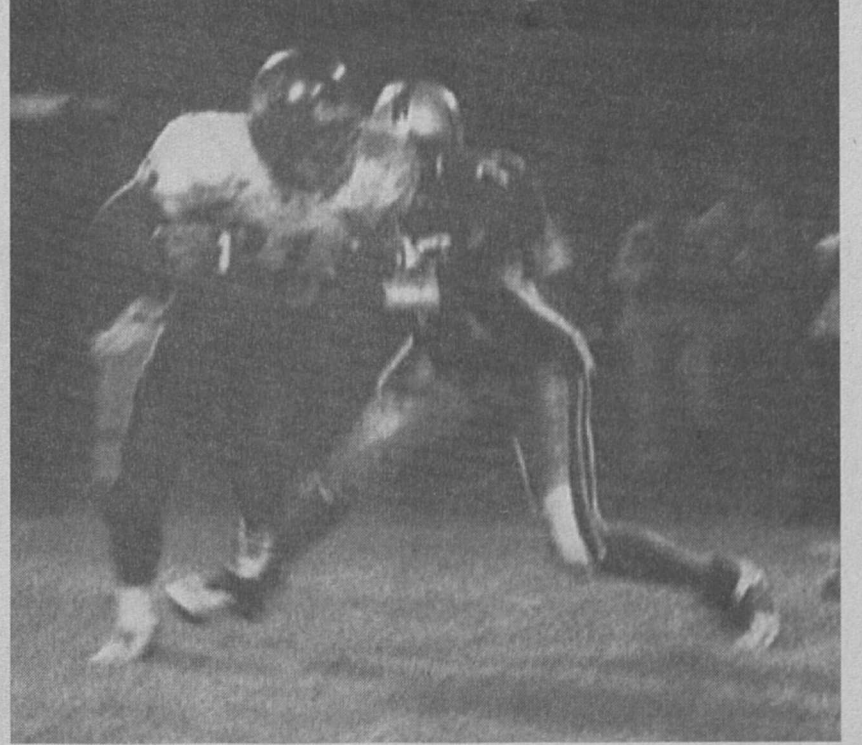

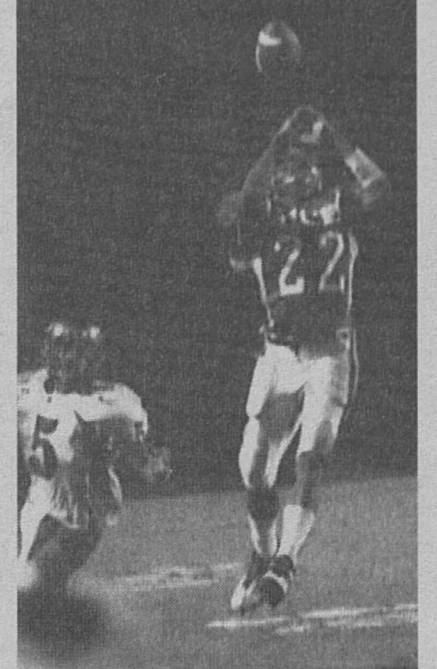

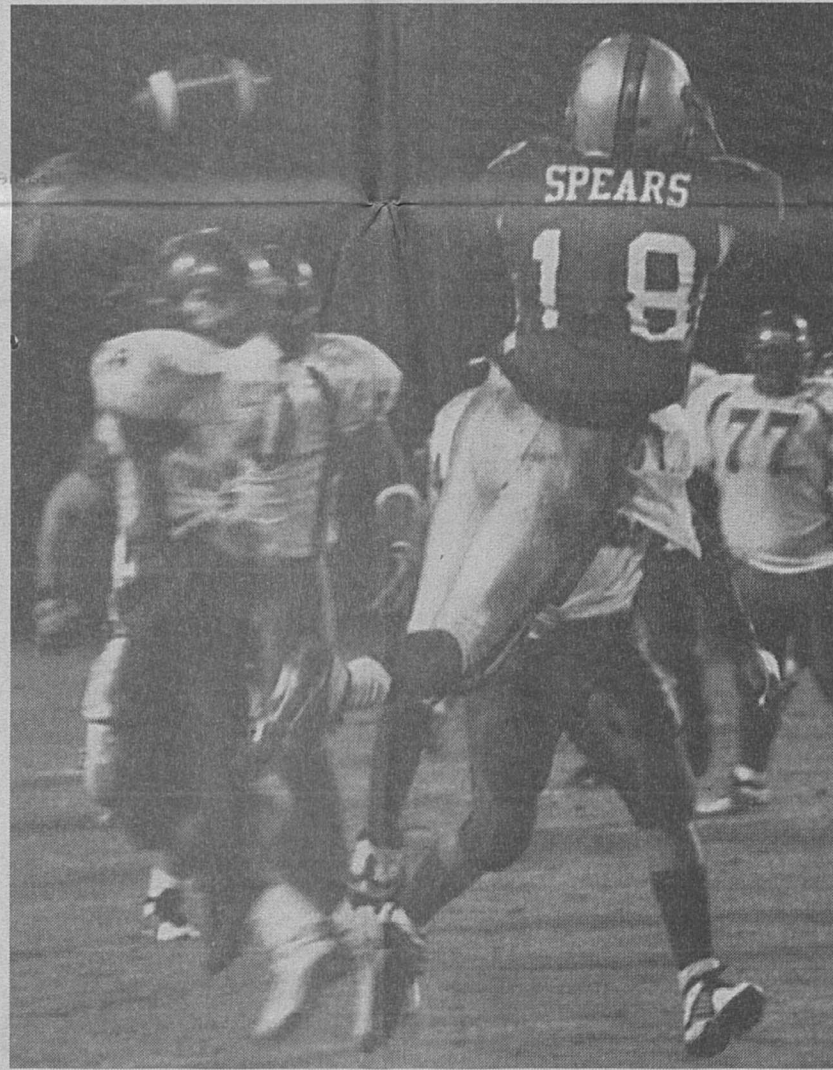

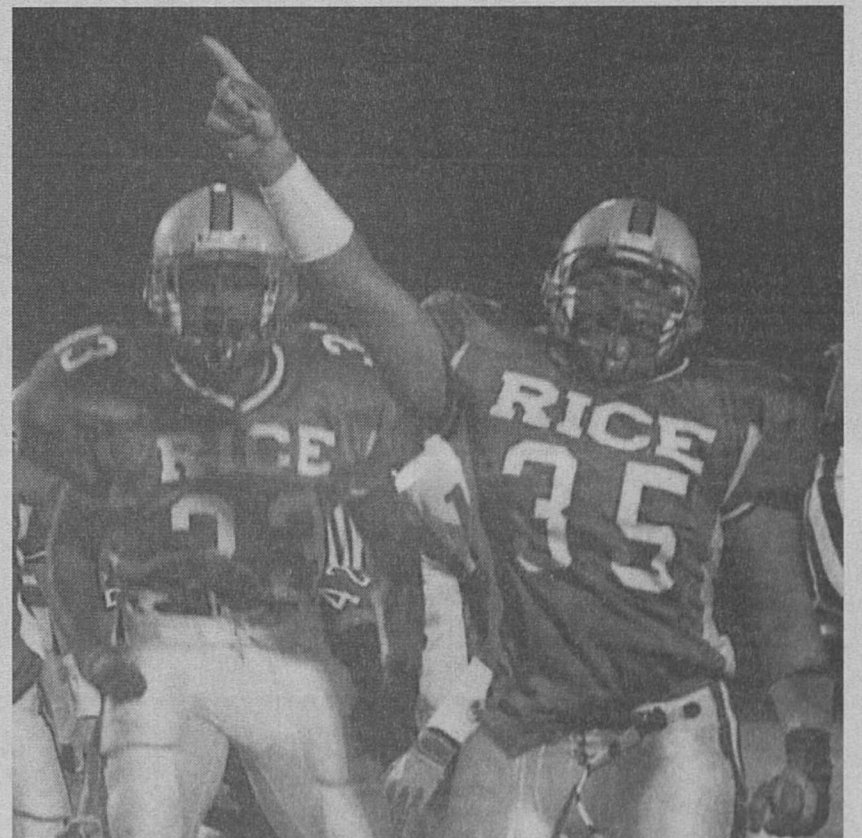

**FUNGAL NAIL TREATMENT**

The drug terbinafine is an effective option for treating and preventing recurrences of fungal nails. Called onychomycosis, fungal nails are marked by a discoloration and thickening of the nails. Sometimes these nails become so thick that walking is painful when wearing shoes. Diabetics are more susceptible to complications from fungal nail infections, including bacterial infections and ulcers. Taking one 250-mg tablet of terbinafine orally each day has been shown to reduce painful symptoms, improve the appearance of nails, and improve quality of life for patients. The medication works by attacking the fungus from the inside, as opposed to treating it externally with creams and lotions. Terbinafine also promotes the growth of healthy new nails.

If fungal nails or any other foot problem does manage to get past your regular regime of good foot care, don't try to treat it yourself.
