Antibiotics Are Best for Rosacea

Rosacea is a chronic inflammatory skin condition that affects millions of Americans. Generally there is a persistent redness on the central part of the face. Bumps and pimples also may occur. If left untreated, broken blood vessels in the skin may appear. The skin may thicken, making the nose look red and bulbous. The exact cause of rosacea is not known. This condition, which is sometimes confused with acne, often appears in fair-skinned persons during middle age. Rosacea can be aggravated by spicy foods, sun, wind, hot weather, strenuous exercise, alcohol, colds, stress, and caffeine.

Both oral and topical antibiotics are prescribed for rosacea. Antibiotics used include *minocycline*, *tetracycline*, and *erythromycin*. A new study is looking into reports that users of the antibiotic *doxycycline* for another medical problem experienced a clearing up of rosacea and acne. *Isotretinoin* (Accutane) has sometimes been effective against severe cases of rosacea. To prevent flare ups topical antibiotics such as *metronidazole* (Metrogel) or *azelaic acid* (Azelex) may be effective. Topical steroids like *desonide* (DesOwen) or *hydrocortisone* may help alleviate symptoms initially, but generally are not prescribed long-term.

Crowning or "capping" is the most extensive, but in many ways, the best treatment for badly decayed or eroded teeth. The entire tooth surface is reduced and replaced with an artificial material, such as porcelain or porcelain bonded to metal. When done correctly, crowning will result in the most permanent and natural result and produce a near-perfect esthetic solution.

The teeth to be crowned are reduced approximately one-third in size by a fast-moving rotary instrument. Impressions are made of your teeth and life-sized models built from hard stone. Temporaries are usually used while your final restorations are being made.

The aim in selecting the final color is to have it blend naturally with the rest of your teeth. The objective is to make the crown look as natural as possible. When finished, you shouldn't experience any difference in usage or appearance.
