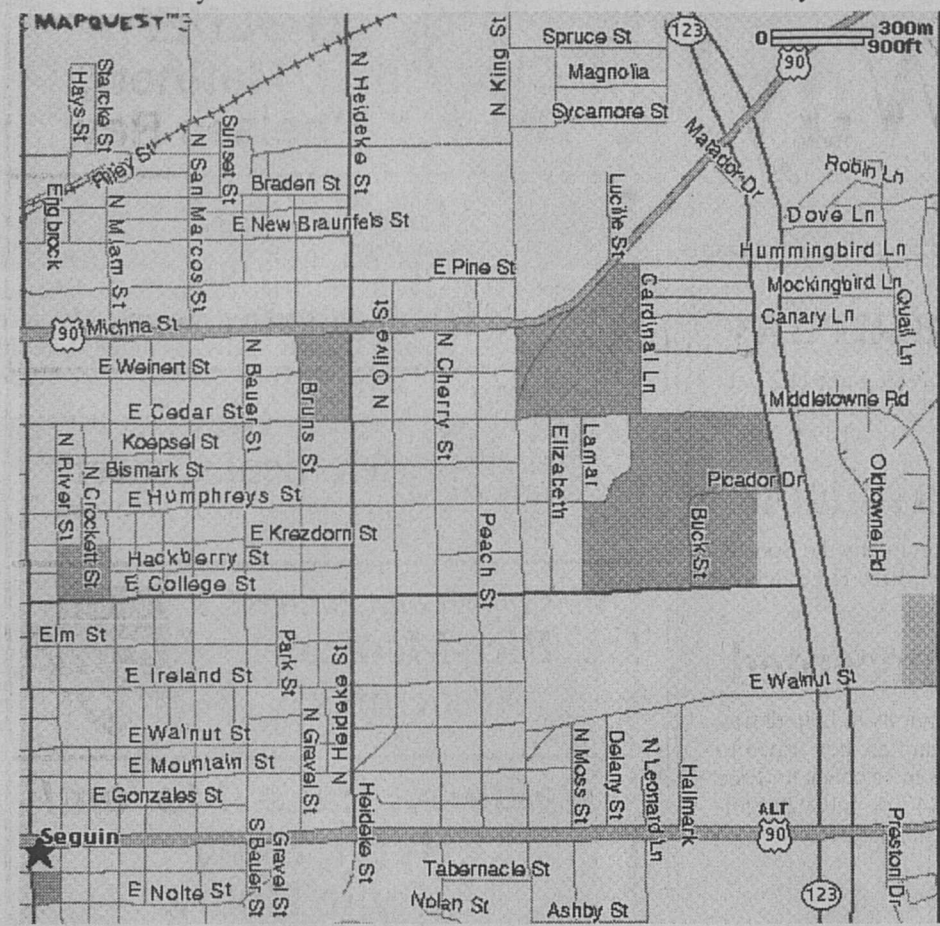
drive. At the 9:25 mark of the fourth period, Michael Cooper scored on a 10-yard run, followed by Milentz' kick, extending the lead to 28-7.

This time Powells' PAT sailed wide, leaving the score Rice 28, Cuero 13, with PAT sailed seven minutes left in the contest.

After a failed outside kick, the Gobblers were done. Coach Russell Roark said, "We didn't play very well or with very much emotion, but when you win a playoff game, you keep on trying. We'll have to play much better and at a higher intensity level from here on out if we want to go any farther."

Defensively, the Raiders held the Gobblers to only 70 rushing yards, while allowing 199 passing.

If you're going I-10, take the 609 exit (TX 123 Business), turn right on E. College, then right on Lamar.

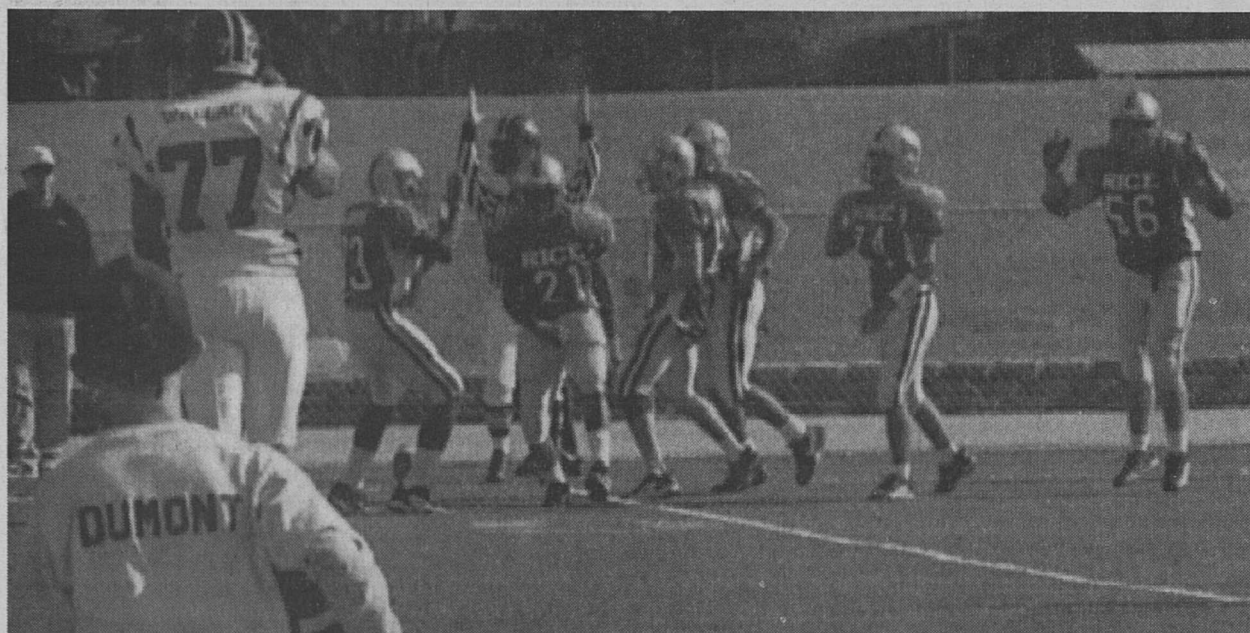

At 4:50 a.m., Officer Alderete met with two complainants at

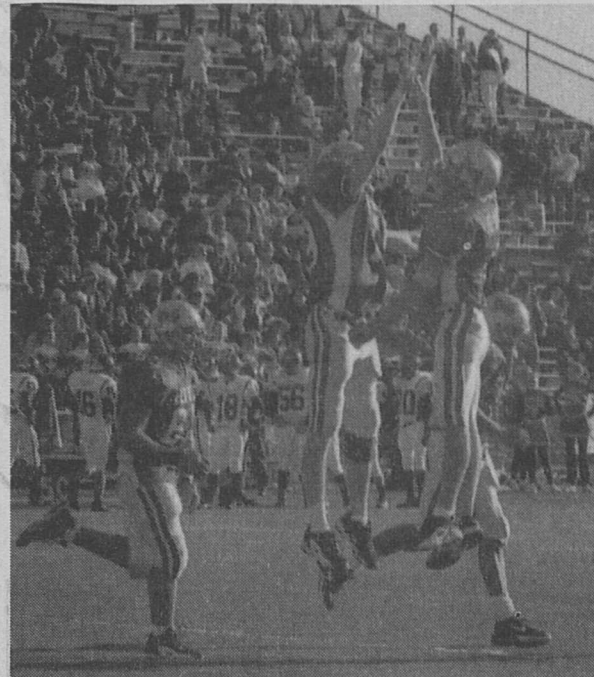

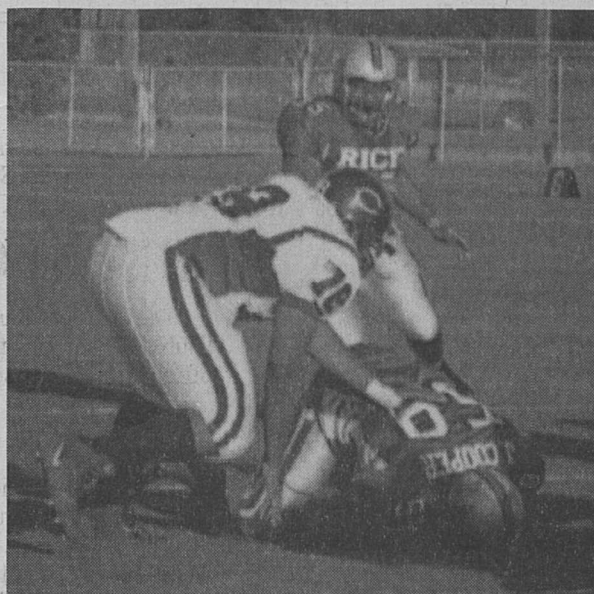

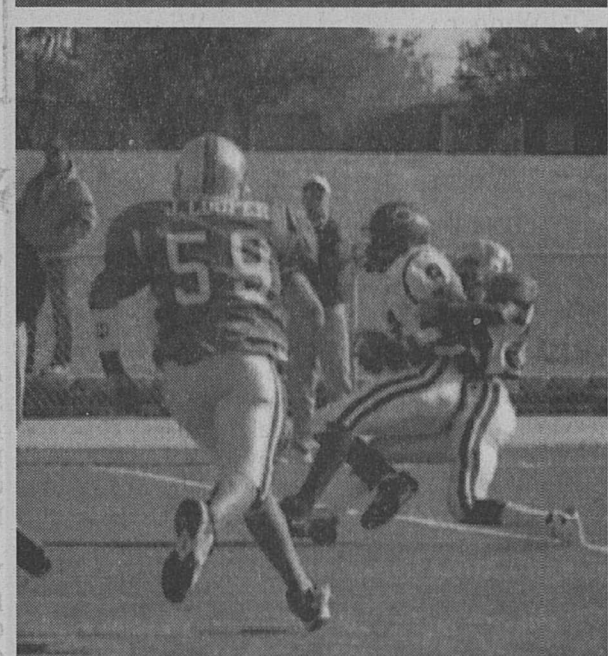
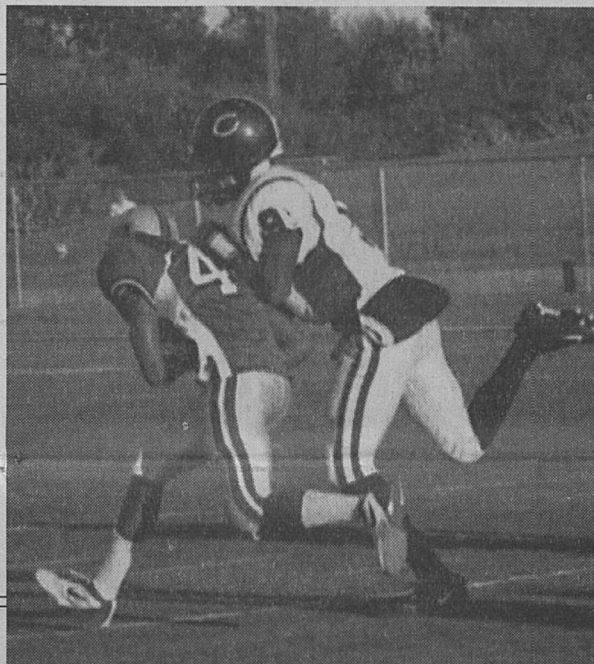
