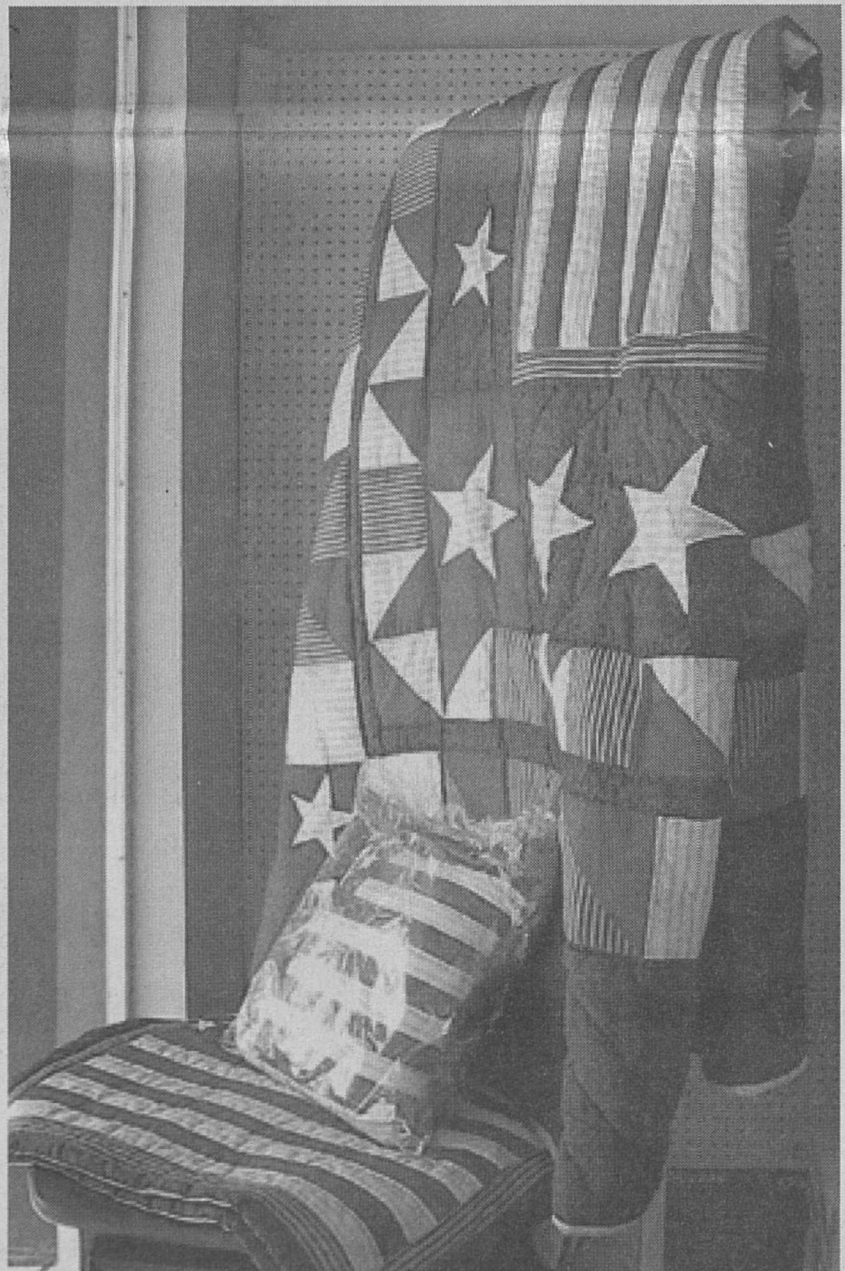

during fiscal year 2001. This money can be used to leverage an additional \$53 million in federal money to cover Texas' child support recovery efforts.

In fiscal year 2001, child support collections increased by 21% compared with the previous fiscal year, the AG's office reports. That represents a jump from \$1 billion collected in 2002 to \$1.2 billion last fiscal year.
