A Colorado County Court jury returned a verdict of acquittal Oct. 9 on a charge of misdemeanor assault involving family violence, but the defendant still got punished.

Roger Allen Waddell, 42, of Waller, was charged with striking his wife in the stomach with his fist at their home in Colorado County on March 19, 2003. Deputy Chad Girndt, with the Colorado County Sheriff's Department investigated the case.

After reading the jury's verdict of acquittal, Colorado County Judge Al Jamison fined Waddell \$250 for contempt of court for violating a pretrial order during his testimony.
