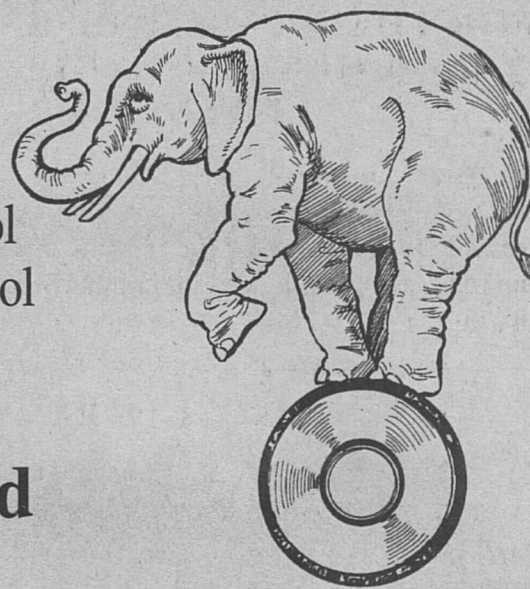

Eight percent of the districts (98) got an "F" in failing to reach goals. Another 15% of the districts (charter schools) were listed as separate campuses.
