

# Project WILD and Aquatic WILD Workshop scheduled

The Welder Wildlife Foundation will host a Project WILD and Aquatic WILD training workshop, which will begin at 5:30 p.m. Friday, Nov. 12 and conclude at 4 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 13.

Certified Project WILD instructor, Larry Hysmith, of the Texas Cooperative Extension at Texas A&M University will present the workshop.

The first half of the workshop will be dedicated to training in the projects and Saturday afternoon will be spent at a wetland setting for a session on aquatic ecology field training.

Project WILD is an interdisciplinary, supplementary conservation education program for educators of kindergarten through high school age

young people. This workshop will provide participants with instructional manuals that emphasize wildlife, natural resources, and conservation. Activities outlined in the manuals are easily integrated into existing courses of study.

There is a \$35 fee for workshop expenses, bunkhouse lodging, and meals on Saturday.


