The Department of Public Safety (DPS) will be on the lookout this Thanksgiving holiday for seatbelt violators, speeders, and drunk drivers.

The Department will be participating in two campaigns called "Click It or Ticket" and Operation CARE (Combined Accident Reduction Effort).

"We're now entering that time of year where more drivers are on the road. Many people will not be wearing their seatbelts and some drivers will be impaired," said Senior Trooper Gary Pflughaupt. "DPS will have all available troopers out on the road during the Thanksgiving holiday."

The Click It or Ticket campaign begins Sunday, Nov. 14 and ends on Sunday, Nov. 28, a total of 15 days.

Operation Care is a nationwide effort to reduce fatalities during holiday seasons.

DPS Troopers will be joining other state agencies with the goal of keeping our highways safe. Operation Care starts Wednesday, Nov. 24 and concludes Sunday, Nov. 28, a total of five days.

"These campaigns help raise public awareness of the penalties one could incur if found driving recklessly in the state of Texas," Pflughaupt said. "We urge parents to set an example by wearing their seatbelts and to utilize car safety seats for their children."

Other safety tips:

- Obey the speed limit, wear safety belts and drive sober.
- Remember the Stranded/Disabled Motorist Help-line number for roadside emergencies 1-800-525-5555.
- Inspect car fluid levels, tire air pressure, windshield wipers, and spare tire.
- Place flashlight, blankets, bottled water, snacks, a first aid kit and a mobile phone in your vehicle for breakdown situations.
- Get plenty of rest and drive defensively.
