Blinn College to open Sealy facility in January

Blinn College will begin teaching college credit courses and workforce training at its new location in Sealy beginning in January.

At a special meeting held Oct. 27, the Sealy Independent School District Board of Trustees accepted a proposal from Blinn to provide educational services to Sealy and Austin County. The board had earlier received proposals from Blinn and Wharton County Junior College who had both been invited to present proposals for such services.

In 1995 the Texas Legislature, through Senate Bill 397, assigned service areas to the state's 50 community colleges. Austin County was divided between Blinn and Wharton but with no clear boundary, thus leaving Sealy as an undesignated area. Both colleges have been providing dual credit classes for Sealy students. Blinn has also been providing workforce training for Stewart and Stevenson and for Wal-Mart.

Blinn's plans are to renovate just under 10,000 square feet in the Sealy Outlet Center to provide for six classrooms and other support facilities.

"We plan to begin with basic academic courses starting with the spring semester on Jan. 18," said Blinn president Donald E. Voelter. "We will follow closely with workforce education training — classes for employees of

industries and businesses."

Joe Al Picone, the college's dean of financial services, will be the interim director of new location.

Picone joined the Blinn staff in 1991. A Blinn graduate and former Brenham savings and loan administrator, served as a member of the college board of trustees from 1974-1991.

A Brenham native, he graduated from Brenham High School and, after graduating from Blinn, earned his bachelor of business administration degree from Baylor University.

He has been very active in civic endeavors and is known throughout area, as well as the state, for his work with Lions International.

"I look forward to working with the community and school leaders in the Sealy area in developing an educational program that is in keeping with the same standards of excellence and success that Blinn College has provided at its other locations," Picone

said.

Picone and his wife, Merle, a mathematics teacher in the Brenham Independent School District, have two sons and one granddaughter.

Blinn College began in Brenham in 1883-

Blinn was founded in Brenham in 1883 as Mission Institute, a private coeducational institution operated by the Southern German Conference of the Methodist Church. In 1889 the name was changed to Blinn Memorial College in honor of the Rev. Christian Blinn of New York who donated a large sum of money to the institution.

In 1927 the school was organized into a junior college and two years later merged with Southwestern University in Georgetown. This association lasted until 1935 when it was organized as a private nondenominational junior college. In 1937 a junior




