
May 3, 1916 - November 27, 2004

Texas A&M Engineering receives DOE grant for treating oilfield wastewater

Texas A&M Engineering petroleum engineers have received a \$596,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to develop new cleaning technology for treating oilfield brine.

Heading the project will be David Burnett, a researcher in Texas A&M's Harold Vance Department of Petroleum Engineering and director of technology for the Global Petroleum Re-

search Institute (GPRI) in the Texas Engineering Experiment Station (TEES).

In Texas, the oil industry produces 7 to 10 times as much water as oil and gas, Burnett said. The process of drilling, fracturing and completing a well requires and then yields a lot of water. All that water that comes back when the well is completed is contaminated by reservoir rock and hy-

drocarbons from the crude oil and gas. The brine also contains traces of dissolved minerals and chemicals such as silica and heavy metals. Producers re-inject this brine for pressure maintenance and to recover more oil from the reservoir.

Because the water contains hazardous chemicals, it cannot be used for any beneficial purpose unless those materials are removed. Until recently it was not cost effective to treat this wastewater even in water-poor areas of the state. But Burnett said nowadays, with new technology, the water can be treated and reused, especially in places where there's not much oil in the water, such as water from coal beds.

"Water from coal beds is relatively clean water, like seltzer," Burnett said. "It needs only minimal treatment, but it's still considered a hazardous mate-
